Supplemental Sheets to Application by Allen Grossman for Ethics Commission Seat 1

Business and/or professional experience:

Until my retirement about six years ago, I practiced law in Illinois from 1951 and in California from 1977, when I moved to San Francisco. During that period, I was a business lawyer primarily serving business clients. As such, my practice embraced a broad range and wide variety of legal matters that affected businessmen, their companies and their activities. For some clients, including two public companies, I served as outside General Counsel.

The professional experience I gained after I retired is particularly relevant to one area of the Ethics Commission's jurisdiction. It came from my active involvement in the San Francisco's open government law -- the San Francisco Sunshine Ordinance, its creation - the San Francisco Sunshine Task Force (SOTF) - and the Ethics Commission's role under the Sunshine Ordinance.

My involvement in "sunshine" matters is known to the continuing Ethics Commissioners and its Executive Director for two reasons: first, the written material I submitted to the Commission regarding its staff's proposed draft Regulations governing SOTF referrals and willful violations of the Sunshine Ordinance; and, second, my successful 2009/2010 lawsuit against the Commission, as a result of which I obtained copies of all the Commission's investigative and other records involving all 14 SOTF enforcement referrals previously dismissed by the Commission, including two referrals based on my SOTF complaints against the Mayor's Office and the District Attorney's Office.

In addition, I have appeared quite a few times before the Commission, including an extended discussion with its members with regard to those draft Regulations, and have given its Executive Director my views on several legal issues relating to SOTF enforcement referrals, primarily in connection with my two records requests referred to the Commission.

During the same period, I have been very active with the SOTF, having appeared before it dozens of times, both as a complainant seeking records and as a member of the public providing the SOTF members with my legal views on those occasions when I disagreed with the City Attorney's advice to the SOTF or in specific matters heard by it. I also have been a *de facto* advisor to the SOTF Committee currently completing its proposed changes to the draft "sunshine" Regulations prepared by Ethics staff.

As result, I am familiar with the Commission's current Regulations governing the procedure for Ethics law violations and other areas under its jurisdiction, how the Commission staff conducts its investigations and the "sunshine" procedure currently being developed by its staff and SOTF. This cumulative experience with the Commission, its staff and its procedures and with the SOTF coupled with my legal training, would enable me to hit the ground running as a Commissioner if appointed to the vacant seat.

Civic Activities

In addition to my activity as a “sunshine” advocate following my retirement, my principal civic activity has been directed to how to sustain and enhance the City’s urban forest. I have been and continue to be heavily involved in the administration and enforcement of the two laws that govern the city’s urban forest - the Urban Forest Ordinance and the Planning Code - and in seeking to expand the City’s programs and the reach of those two laws.

My efforts to improve the City’s urban forest programs have utilized various means and approaches. For example, I have met many times with Planning Department and Department of Public Works personnel, including DPW’s current Director, as well as the Mayor’s Greening Director, to discuss legislation and enforcement; I participated, by invitation, in the Planning Department’s meetings in which an Urban Forest Master Plan was being developed. I have continually pressed DPW to improve its enforcement of the existing law on illegal street tree removals. My most recent action, through the SF Urban Forest Coalition, a non-for-profit corporation I founded in 2007 and support, was filing a lawsuit, last September, against the Planning Department to require it to identify and enforce the Planning Code Street tree planting requirements. That case is now pending.

In sum, I consider myself an advocate for the public and its representative in my activities. I strongly believe that supporting government transparency includes supporting laws requiring disclosure of conflicts of interest and political campaign, lobbyist, campaign consultant and officials' economic interests. As a Commissioner, I would continue to advocate for and represent the public broadly to ensure San Francisco’s ethics and good government laws are enforced as the public intended them to be, and having demonstrated I have no political agenda, I would aggressively pursue the Commission’s goals as expressed in its Mission Statement.



I am pleased to write in support of Dorothy S. Liu's application to the San Francisco Ethics Commission.



She also ran a legal clinic for low income San Francisco residents.

In short, there is no better candidate for the Board's appointment to the Ethics Commission. Dot will work hard, provide leadership, and be an agent for change. 

Charter Section 15.100. (Proposition E – Elections, Ethics & Outside Counsel approved by the voters on November 6, 2001)

Board Qualifications:

The Ethics Commission shall consist of five members, one member of whom is appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The member appointed by the Board of Supervisors shall be broadly representative of the general public.

The Mayor, the City Attorney, the District Attorney and the Assessor each shall appoint one member of the Commission that comprise the other four members. The member appointed by the Mayor shall have a background in public information and public meetings. The member appointed by the City Attorney shall have a background in law as it relates to government ethics. The member appointed by the Assessor shall have a background in campaign finance. The member appointed by the District Attorney shall be broadly representative of the general public.

The members shall serve six-year terms, provided that the first five commissioners to be appointed to take office on the first day of February 2002 shall by lot classify their terms so that the term of one commissioner shall expire at 12:00 noon on each of the second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth anniversaries of such date, and on the expiration of these and successive terms of office, the appointments shall be made for six-year terms. In the event of a vacancy, the officer who appointed the member vacating the office shall appoint a qualified person to complete the remainder of the term.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Members of the Commission shall be officers of the City and County, and may be removed by the appointing authority only pursuant to Section 15.105. No person may serve more than one six-year term as a member of the Commission, provided that persons appointed to fill a vacancy for an unexpired term with less than three years remaining or appointed to an initial term of three or fewer years shall be eligible to be appointed to one additional six-year term. Any term served before the effective date of this Section shall not count toward a member's term limit. Any person who completes a term as a Commissioner shall be eligible for reappointment six years after the expiration of his or her term.

During his or her tenure, a member of the Commission may not: hold any other City or County office or be an officer of a political party. No member or employee of the Ethics Commission may be a registered lobbyist or campaign consultant, or be employed by or receive gifts or other compensation from a registered lobbyist or campaign consultant. No member or employee of the Ethics Commission may participate in any campaign supporting or opposing a candidate for City elective office, a City ballot measure, or a City officer running for any elective office. Participation in a campaign includes but is not limited to making contributions or soliciting contributions to any committee within the Ethics Commission's jurisdiction, publicly endorsing or urging endorsement of a candidate or ballot measure, or participating in decisions by organizations to participate in a campaign.

The Commission may subpoena witnesses, compel their attendance and testimony, administer oaths and affirmations, take evidence and require by subpoena the production of any books, papers, records or other items material to the performance of the Commission's duties or exercise of its powers.

The Commission serves the public, city employees and officials and candidates for public office through education and enforcement of ethics laws. The Commission provides open access to public records in ethics-related matters. The Commission acts as filing officer for, and auditor of, financial disclosure statements filed by political candidates and committees and designated City and County employees. The Commission assesses fees and penalties for failure to adhere to deadlines and requirements, audits statements to ensure compliance with contribution limits, administers an education program, and produces educational materials. It also oversees registration and regulation of lobbyists, investigates ethics complaints, provides advice on ethical matters and publishes statistical reports.

Its duties include: filing and auditing of campaign finance disclosure statements; campaign consultant registration and regulation; lobbyist registration and regulation; filing officer for statements of economic interest; administration of the Whistleblower program; investigations of ethics complaints; enforcement education and training; and providing advice and statistical reporting.
