

1 [State grant funds for mosquito control.]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health to retroactively**  
4 **accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$30,000 from the California Department of**  
5 **Health Services to mitigate the threat of West Nile virus transmission through mosquito**  
6 **control activities, for the period of July 1, 2006 to June 30, 2007.**

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8 WHEREAS, The California Department of Health Services, Vector Borne Disease  
9 Section (DHS-VBDS) awarded the San Francisco Department of Public Health Environmental  
10 Health Section (DPH-EHS) an award for \$30,000 to enhance and expand mosquito control  
11 activities to reduce the risk of West Nile virus transmission to residents of San Francisco; and,

12 WHEREAS, These funds will allow the DPH-EHS Mosquito Control program to do  
13 more effective mosquito control by partially funding two Public Service Aides to offer  
14 inspections of properties where mosquito activity is reported or suspected and develop and  
15 distribute mosquito control educational materials; and,

16 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment and reimburses the  
17 department for two existing, temporary Public Service Aides (Job Class 9924) at 0.80 FTE (.4  
18 x 2) from March 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007; and

19 WHEREAS, The grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget; now  
20 therefore, be it

21 RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend a  
22 grant in the amount of \$30,000 from the California DHS-VBDS; and, be it

23 FURTHER RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and  
24 expend the grant funds in accordance with the requirements set forth in the Agreement,  
25 pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and, be it

1           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of  
2 indirect costs in the budget of the Agreement; and, be it

3           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the positions  
4 funded under this agreement as "G" or grant-funded positions which would terminate when  
5 the agreement expires.
