

1 [Appointments – Children’s Collaborative Task Force]

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3 **Motion appointing Sharon Olken, Leslie Trook, Dr. Rondall Lane, Markus Hunt, terms to**  
4 **be determined at first meeting, to the Children’s Collaborative Task Force, residency**  
5 **requirement waived.**

6 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does  
7 hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Children’s  
8 Collaborative Task Force, pursuant to Resolution 358-07.

9 Sharon Olken, new appointment, seat 1, must be a teacher and/or an education  
10 professional currently employed by a public school in San Francisco, for a two-year term to  
11 be determined at first meeting.

12 Leslie Trook, new appointment, seat 2, must be a teacher and/or an education  
13 professional currently employed by a public school in San Francisco, for a two-year term to be  
14 determined at first meeting.

15 Dr. Rondall Lane, new appointment, seat 3, must be a teacher and/or an education  
16 professional currently employed by a public school in San Francisco, for a two-year term to be  
17 determined at first meeting.

18 Markus Hunt (residency requirement waived), new appointment, seat 10, must be a  
19 teacher and/or an education professional currently employed by a private school in San  
20 Francisco, for a two-year term to be determined at first meeting.

21 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 22 1. The membership of the Children’s Collaborative Task Force has a goal to be  
23 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.

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- 1           2. Applicant Markus Hunt, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is  
2           a person with experience that uniquely qualifies him to serve on the Children’s  
3           Collaborative Task Force.
- 4           3. The Children’s Collaborative Task Force has attempted to fill the position, for which  
5           Markus Hunt was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has  
6           the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at  
7           this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Markus Hunt is qualified to serve  
8           on the Children’s Collaborative Task Force.
- 9           4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no  
10          other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the  
11          specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is  
12          willing to serve on the Children’s Collaborative Task Force at this time; and, be it  
13          FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement  
14          for Markus Hunt, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be  
15          found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to  
16          boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of  
17          Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.

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
