Resolution approving the City Attorney's entry into a Second Extension of Tolling
 Agreement governing administrative proceeding or suit by the United States
 Environmental Protection Agency and the Casmalia Resources Site Steering
 Committee, effective June 6, 2003.

- 8 WHEREAS, The United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") claims the
 9 City and County of San Francisco has shipped hazardous wastes to the Casmalia Superfund
 10 Site, which is a hazardous waste landfill in Santa Barbara County ("the Site"); and
- WHEREAS, The EPA has filed a lawsuit under the Comprehensive Environmental
 Response, Compensation and Liability Act against the City, entitled United States of America
 v. Samson Hydrocarbons Company, et al., No. 03-CV-1078, in the federal district court for the
 Central District of California, in which EPA seeks an order requiring the City to participate in
 the costs of cleaning up and closing the Site; and
- WHEREAS, The Casmalia Resources Site Steering Committee ("Committee") has stated its intent to bring a lawsuit against the City for contribution and partial indemnity for the costs of complying with a consent decree into which the Committee members have entered with EPA requiring the same cleanup and closing; and
- WHEREAS, The City entered into an agreement by which the statute of limitations on any proceeding or lawsuit by EPA or the Committee against the City shall be tolled, or suspended, for 18 months ("Tolling Agreement"), effective on June 7, 2000 (Resolution 294-00) and extended that agreement for an additional 18 months, effective December 7, 2001 (Resolution 3-02); and

1	WHEREAS, On, October 15, 2001, the Board of Supervisors approved Resolution 787-
2	01, approving a settlement of these claims in an amount not to exceed \$180,000; and
3	WHEREAS, the court has not yet approved the final Consent Decree by which the City,
4	EPA and other potentially responsible parties will finally resolve liability at the Site; and
5	WHEREAS, The EPA and Committee have requested, and the City Attorney
6	recommends, that the City agree to extend the existing Tolling Agreement by another 18
7	months in order to allow for final settlement without litigation;
8	WHEREAS, the EPA and Committee have executed the extension to the Tolling
9	Agreement effective June 6, 2003; now therefore be it,
10	RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 10.22 of the San Francisco Administrative Code,
11	the entry by the City into a Second Amendment to Tolling Agreement is hereby approved.
