2 AMENDING THE RULES OF ORDER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CITY
3 AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO BY AMENDING RULE 6.1 TO PROVIDE THAT,
4 BEGINNING IN 2001, THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD SHALL BE ELECTED FOR A
5 TWO-YEAR TERM BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ON THE
6 EIGHTH DAY OF JANUARY IN ODD-NUMBERED YEARS.

10 WHEREAS, The City Charter of the City and County of San Francisco requires that,
11 effective January 8, 2001, the President of the Board of Supervisors shall be elected by a
12 majority vote of the Board; and

13 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors wishes to amend its Rules of Order to reflect the
14 requirements of the City Charter, and to include procedures for facilitating the Presidential
15 election process; now, therefore, be it

16 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
17 hereby amends Rule 6.1 of the Rules of Order of the Board, to read as follows:

18 **6.1 ORGANIZATION AND ELECTION OF PRESIDENT.** ((At its regular meeting)) At
19 12:00 noon on the 8th day of January in odd-numbered years next following their election, or
20 at 10:00 a.m. on the following business day if the 8th of January falls on a Saturday, Sunday or
21 holiday, the newly elected and continuing members of ((,)) the Board shall meet at the
22 Legislative Chamber in City Hall. The Board shall by majority vote elect one of its members
23 as President for a two-year term. If a vacancy in the office of President of the Board shall
24 occur prior to the end of the term, the Board shall by a majority vote elect one of its members
25 to fill the unexpired portion of the term. At the time designated for the election of a Board

1 President, the presiding officer shall entertain nominations from the Supervisors for the
2 position of President. When there are no further nominations, the presiding officer shall
3 declare the nominations closed, and the Clerk of the Board shall then call the roll of
4 Supervisors. If no nominee receives a majority of the votes, then the presiding officer shall
5 direct additional roll calls until a nominee receives a majority vote and a President is elected.
6 The members of the Board may, by majority vote, and at any time during the election process,
7 reopen nominations.


