ACCOUNTABILITY CHALLENGE GRANT II (JCE&ACG) PROGRAM TO
CONTINUE TO IMPLEMENT THE LOCAL ACTION PLAN THAT ADDRESSES
THE NEEDS OF YOUTH WHO ARE INVOLVED IN THE JUVENILE JUSTICE
SYSTEM,

WHEREAS, the 1998-99 Budget Act (Chapter 324, Statutes of 1998) provides \$10
million for implementation and SB 2108 provides an additional \$50 million to the
Juvenile Crime Enforcement & Accountability Challenge Grant (JCE&ACG) amending
the existing JCE&CG Program currently administered by the State Board of Corrections;
and,

WHEREAS, the JCE&ACG program directs the Board of Corrections to award
up to \$54.5 million for county grant projects on a competitive basis that develop and
implement strategies that provide an effective continuum of responses for the prevention,
intervention, supervision, treatment, and incarceration of juvenile offenders that are
directed to male and female offenders and requires consideration of strategies to develop
and implement locally or regionally based out-of-home placement options for youths
described in Section 602 of the Welfare and Institution Code; and,

1 WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco, in adherence to Board of
2 Corrections requirements, has established the San Francisco Juvenile Justice
3 Coordinating Council whose members include representatives from each of the following
4 organizations: the Adult Probation Department, the District Attorney; the Police; the
5 Public Defender; the Sheriff; the Board of Supervisors; the Department of Human
6 Services, the Department of Public Health (including the Mental Health Division), the
7 San Francisco Unified School District, the Recreation and Parks Department, a parent, a
8 youth, a community based agency and the Mayor, on file with the Clerk of the Board of
9 Supervisors in File No. 214-96-4.1; and,

11 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco, in adherence to the Board of
12 Corrections requirements, has authorized the Chief Probation Officer, Jesse E. Williams
13 Jr., as chair of the San Francisco Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council; and,

15 WHEREAS, The Director of the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council is authorized
16 to sign the City and County of San Francisco's application for State JCEACG program
17 funding as well as related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State of
18 California; and,

20 WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco has previously developed and
21 adopted a Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan for implementation which identified
22 strategies that provide an effective continuum of responses for the prevention,
23 intervention, supervision, treatment, and incarceration of juvenile offenders in File No.
24 68-97-7; and
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



FURTHER RESOLVED, that the eight new positions authorized under the grant shall be designated as "G" or "Grant-funded" positions, which would terminate when the grant expires.




