WHEREAS, Over 93,000 absentee ballots have been requested for the December 14 run-off election; and,

WHEREAS, Absentee ballots currently require a signature on the pre-printed return envelope in order to be counted as a valid ballot; and,

WHEREAS, The instructions on the return envelope requesting a signature are only in English, and as such, may violate requirements under the federal Voting Rights Act; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco has the most diverse voting population in the nation - where the next census estimates will include 11 different languages, among them, English, Chinese, Spanish, Vietnamese, Russian, Tagalog, and Japanese; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Elections should make every effort to protect the voting rights of all San Francisco voters, including both English and limited-English speaking voters; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby urges the Registrar of Voters and the

Department of Elections to accept as valid absentee ballots where the voter has substantially complied or extend the time necessary for verification, if necessary; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco requests that the Citizens Advisory Committee on Elections review the accessibility and customer service for all San Francisco voters; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco requests the Citizens Advisory Committee provide a report on increasing the efficiency of the Department of Elections to the Board of Supervisors in 60 days.
