APPOINTING MEMBER(S) TO THE VETERANS AFFAIRS COMMISSION; WAIVING
RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT.

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County
of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated
person(s) to serve as member(s) of the veterans Affairs Commission,
pursuant to the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative Code,
Section 5.102, for the terms specified:

Leonard Grube, succeeding himself, (Seat No. 1, must be at-large
appointment), term expired, for a new four-year term ending
January 31, 2003.

Charles Coolidge, Jr., succeeding himself, (Seat No. 7, must be
at-large appointment), term expired, for a new four-year term ending
January 31, 2003.

Maceo May, succeeding himself, (Seat No. 8, must be at-large
appointment), term expired, for a new four-year term ending
January 31, 2003.

Robert DeLaCruz, succeeding himself, (Seat No. 11, must be at-
large appointment), term expired, for a new four-year term ending
January 31, 2003.

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the
2 following findings:

- 3 1. The membership of the Veterans Affairs Commission has a goal
4 to be representative of the diversity of the City and County
5 of San Francisco.
- 6 2. Applicant Maceo May, an appointee, who is not a resident of
7 San Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely
8 qualifies him to serve on the Veterans Affairs Commission.
- 9 3. The Veterans Affairs Commission has attempted to fill the
10 position, for which Maceo May was nominated, with an
11 individual who is a City resident and who has the specific
12 experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable
13 to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified
14 that Maceo May is qualified to serve on the Veterans Affairs
15 Commission.
- 16 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors
17 concludes that there is no other possible representative, who
18 is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific
19 experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this
20 applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Veterans
21 Affairs Commission at this time; and, be it

22 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the
23 residency requirement for Maceo May, as allowed in cases where no
24 qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to
25 Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed

1 to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by
2 legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the
3 City and County of San Francisco.
