

Who I am: I've been a resident of San Francisco since 1997. My partner and I have lived in District 11 since 2006, and are happy to call it our permanent home. This area is unique and precious in San Francisco for its economic and demographic diversity, relative affordability, and transit richness. I'd like to summarize the qualifications and perspectives I would bring to the following seats:

(1) Muni rider: I've been a Muni rider for 15 years. I often take the M or J from Balboa Park. The special mix of Muni, BART and freeways provide this hub with great advantages as well as significant challenges, which planning should integrate into an overall experience.

(2) BART rider: I take BART almost every day for my work commute (from Balboa Park to Colma, where I catch a coach). I'm passionate about accessibility, safety, reliability, cleanliness and the visual appeal of the BART experience. For example, over the past 2 years I've engaged with DPW (especially through Sandra Zuniga) to keep the wooded area of the walkway to BART from San Jose Avenue clean and safe (until then, it was essentially treated as a garbage dump. Thanks to DPW for adding it to a regular maintenance route.)

(3) Bicyclist and pedestrian: Until joining Apple in 2005, I commuted mostly by bike and on foot/Muni. I still bike as much as I can, and often bike and walk through the Station area. I've been a member and volunteer with the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition for 13 years.

(9) Neighborhood resident: I'm deeply committed to this neighborhood. I work informally with residents of my block to create steady improvements, and now wish to find ways to help the neighborhood beyond my block. There is so much unrealized potential here.

My career's been focused in three areas: education, project management, and product management. Each of these disciplines affords experiences and skills that would be valuable on the CAC. I am applying for Seat 6, Community and Economic Development, on the Balboa Park Station Citizen Advisory Committee (BPS CAC). I have lived near the station for a total of four years, and took classes at the main campus of City College for five. I walk or use Muni and BART at or near the station daily, including a twice-daily trip by foot along Ocean Ave to my workplace. My job as Safety Coordinator at the Excelsior Action Group allows me to work on issues related to pedestrian and bicycling safety, as well as supporting local businesses with neighborhood beautification, frequent public events, and crime prevention. Being a member of the BPS CAC would tie in well with my goal of making sure that streets in my community are safe and accessible to all, and small businesses are able to thrive.

I am committed to civic participation, as exemplified by my positions on the Community Police Advisory Board and the San Francisco Women's Political Committee. I have been attending and speaking at public hearings and meetings at City Hall for seven years. Board Qualifications:

The CAC shall have a minimum of five voting members and no more than nine, representing diverse capacities and backgrounds, who also have a stake in the neighborhoods served by Balboa Park Station. The seats to be filled shall represent the following stakeholder groups: 1) Muni rider interests; 2) BART rider interests; 3) pedestrian and bicycle interests; 4) students, faculty and staff (particularly from City College or other area schools; 5) senior/disabled community; 6) community and economic development; 7) land use and housing; 8) youth and families; and 9) neighborhood resident interests.

The Board of Supervisors established the Balboa Park Community Advisory Committee (CAC) for the purpose of providing input and community oversight on the prioritization and implementation of transportation and other public improvements; relaying information to community stakeholders; and serving as a forum for coordination, information-sharing, and collaboration between community, transportation agencies, and developers.

That CAC meetings shall be held at the minimum of once every quarter, and the CAC meetings shall be open to the public, providing opportunities for the community to receive station-related information and reports. Public postings and announcements shall be used to raise awareness regarding the meetings.

Sunset Date: The CAC shall sunset two years after the date of the first meeting, unless the Board of Supervisors, by resolution extends its term, based on community need and progress on
