Fla.), in order to resolve the lawsuit filed by Jenny Ramirez Valdivia against the City and County of San Francisco; the lawsuit was filed on August 10, 2021, in San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CGC-21-594081; entitled Jenny Ramirez Valdivia v. City and County of San Francisco; the lawsuit involves an alleged dangerous condition of public property encountered while riding a Bird scooter; once the Tort Claims Trust is funded, the terms of Bird's Second Amended Joint Chapter 11 Plan of Liquidation provide that the lawsuit shall be paid solely and exclusively from the Tort Claims Trust, which shall assume any and all liability of the City and County of San Francisco for such lawsuit. City and County of San Francisco; the lawsuit involves a Petition for Writ of Mandate challenging Ordinance No. 18-22, which amended San Francisco Administrative Code, Section 37.9, to require landlords pursuing certain types of evictions to first provide their tenants written notice and an opportunity to cure, unless the eviction is based on an imminent health or safety issue or the nonpayment of COVID-19 rental debt.
