Commander Lyn Tomioka (residency requirement waived), seat 2 (alternate), must be an employee of the City and County of San Francisco and should have significant public safety or related experience, for an indefinite term.

FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Commander Lyn Tomioka, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
