12 WHEREAS, The Northern California Carpenters Regional Council (NCCRC), affiliated
13 with the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America (UBC), represents the
14 interests of working carpenters and retirees throughout Northern California including the
15 members of Local 22 San Francisco; and,

16 WHEREAS, The UBC has been working diligently to improve, protect, and defend the
17 rights of workers in Northern California for over 120 years; and,

18 WHEREAS, The NCCRC maintains a state certified apprenticeship program which
19 teaches new carpenters the skills necessary to build a rewarding career; and,

20 WHEREAS, The NCCRC and Local 22, working with various community based
21 organizations, support local hiring provisions which allow San Francisco residents the
22 opportunity to gain experience in the construction field; and,

23 WHEREAS, The NCCRC provides ongoing training to its journey level carpenters so
24 that they have the necessary skills to work with the latest building materials and construction
25 methods; and,

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1 WHEREAS, Union carpenters have worked on every major construction project in the
2 City and County of San Francisco for more than a century; and,

3 WHEREAS, The Union has always fought for fair wages and benefits which allow
4 carpenters to live, work, and raise their families within the City of San Francisco; and,

5 WHEREAS, Union carpenters have all the skills necessary to safely and efficiently
6 complete every task which they are called upon to perform; now, therefore, be it

7 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco,
8 in the interest of maintaining labor harmony, strongly urge that Lend Lease and/or its sister
9 company Bovis enter into an agreement with the NCCRC so that construction of the new
10 Cruise Terminal Project, located on Pier 30-32, and its associated projects might proceed in
11 accordance with the remarkable history and tradition which the members of the UBC and
12 Local 22 continue to exemplify in their service to the City of San Francisco.
