10	Section 1. Findings.			
11	A. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this			
12	Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public			
13	Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the			
14	Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.			
15	Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending			
16	Section 8.14, to read as follows:

22	(6) Cases specifically exempted by the Med	ical Examiner or his designee.		
23	(b) Beginning with fiscal year 2003-2004, fees	set in this Section may be		
24	adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in			
25	the relevant Consumer Price Index, as determined by the Controller.			

1	No later than April 15 <sup>th</sup> of each year, the Medical Examiner's Office shall submit		
2	its current fee schedule to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to		
3	produce a new fee schedule for the following year.		
4	No later than May 15 <sup>th</sup> of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the		
5	Board of Supervisors reporting the new fee schedule and certifying that: (a) the fees produce		
6	sufficient revenue to support the costs of providing the services for which each fee is		
7	assessed, and (b) the fees do not produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs		
8	of providing the services for which each fee is assessed.		
9	(c) All fees received for documents and services mentioned in this Section		
10	shall be deposited with the Treasurer and shall be used to defray the costs incurred by the		
11	Medical Examiner in issuing such documents or providing such services.
