AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, POPULATION HEALTH AND PREVENTION, COMMUNITY SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES, TO ENTER INTO A SUBCONTRACT WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA SAN FRANCISCO INSTITUTE OF HEALTH POLICY STUDIES, THE PRIMARY CONTRACTOR, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$246,500 TO EVALUATE TREATMENT ON DEMAND POLICIES WHICH INCLUDES RIGHTS IN DATA CLAUSES AND DOES NOT INCLUDE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY INDEMNIFICATION AND FALSE CLAIMS CLAUSES; RETROACTIVE TO SEPTEMBER 28, 1999.

WHEREAS, Community Substance Abuse Services has negotiated an agreement with UCSF Institute of Health Policy Studies to enter into a collaborative project for evaluation of treatment on demand policies; and,

WHEREAS, The subcontract will support the activities of the designated Department of Public Health Project Director, Alice Gleghorn, Ph.D., who will be responsible for the scientific conduct of the project; and,

WHEREAS, The UCSF Institute of Health Policy Studies has agreed to reimburse the Department of Public Health, Community Substance Abuse Services in the amount of \$246,500 in support of the research activities of this project; and

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds, UCSF Institute of Health Policy Studies requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 000520; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement contains certain provisions described below, which require the approval of the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, The budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$8,399; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health, Community Substance Abuse Services, is hereby authorized to enter retroactively into a subcontract in the amount of \$246,500 with UCSF Institute of Health Policy Studies, the primary contractor; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the agreement pursuant to which the City agrees that all data, reports, and analysis which are generated under this requirement shall become property of the Government; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 21.21 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification of the City by UCSF for the infringement of patent rights, copyright, trademark, and other intellectual property rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 21.35 of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Health to enter into similar agreements with UCSF if the subcontract recurs or is renewed.
