Background

To engage the public in discussion on the role of government surveillance, the Committee on Information Technology (COIT) and its subcommittee the Privacy and Surveillance Advisory Board (PSAB) held 2 public meetings for Social Media Monitoring Software during June 2023 to review and approve the policy. All details of these discussions are available online at sf.gov/coit.

After these meetings, the Committee on Information Technology staff made non-substantive corrections at the request of the Environment Department. These edits include adding three additional job titles to the authorized job titles and personnel cost tables (both found in the Appendix A sections of the Policy and Impact Report) and correcting the floor number in the address for the department in Appendix E in the Policy.

This memo provides details on the review process for the Surveillance Technology Policy, and additional information on COIT's recommendation of approval.
