Mayor, Supervisor Dufty **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**

[Urging Congress to approve funding for housing and supportive services for the chronically homeless.1

Resolution urging Congress to approve \$200 million for the Samaritan Initiative to implement housing and supportive services strategies to end chronic homelessness.

WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco is committed to ending chronic homelessness in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, chronically homeless individuals—those who struggle with the most persistent forms of homelessness— are sometimes afflicted not only by poverty but also by chronic conditions such as mental illness and substance abuse; and

WHEREAS, housing for the chronically homeless is most effective when supportive services regarding physical health, substance abuse, and mental health problems are offered in tandem with housing; and

WHEREAS, significant research has demonstrated that supportive housing models to end chronic homelessness can be highly effective and that the cost of such housing is substantially offset by savings to expensive systems of community care including hospitalization and incarceration; and

WHEREAS, the abolition of chronic homelessness requires collaboration and coordination at all levels of government, together with community institutions, businesses, and neighborhood and faith-based organizations, to determine how best to implement prevention and intervention strategies; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges Congress to pass the \$200 million multi-federal agency budget proposal for the

Samaritan Initiative for the 2005-06 federal budget, which will help cities implement housing and supportive services strategies to end chronic homelessness; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco supports an increased investment of at least \$45 million to be included in the federal government's Projects of Regional and National Significance for the Ending Long Term Homelessness Service Initiative to increase on-site supportive services of the Samaritan Initiative.
