1	[Behested Payment Waiver - Economic Revitalization Efforts]
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3	Resolution authorizing the Mayor, members of the Mayor's Office, and the Director of
4	the Office of Economic and Workforce Development to solicit donations from
5	nonprofits, private organizations, grantmakers, foundations, and other persons and
6	entities for the purpose of supporting the continued economic revitalization of San
7	Francisco, for six months from the effective date of this Resolution, notwithstanding
8	the Behested Payment Ordinance.
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10	WHEREAS, San Francisco has a beautiful and historic downtown area that has long
11	been a connective hub for business, culture, and innovation; and
12	WHEREAS, San Francisco's downtown area is vital to the City's overall health and
13	vibrancy – many residents work, transact business, or live in the area, and it remains a
14	popular destination for both domestic and international visitors; and
15	WHEREAS, San Francisco and its downtown area have faced unprecedented
16	challenges resulting in part from the Covid-19 pandemic, including a rise in homelessness, the
17	closure of businesses, an increased number of residents living in or near poverty, a lack of
18	affordable housing, and residents relocating out of the City; and
19	WHEREAS, While the City has in place numerous policies and initiatives aimed at
20	encouraging a thriving economy in the downtown area and beyond, more resources are
21	urgently needed to make sure the downtown area can be clean, safe, and thriving; and
22	WHEREAS, The City is aware of various charitable public benefit corporations, such as
23	the San Francisco Downtown Development Corporation, that aim to help revitalize San
24	Francisco and specifically its downtown area, to ensure that residents, businesses, and
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visitors have a safe, clean, dynamic, economically vibrant, and innovative place to live, work,
 play, and conduct business; and

WHEREAS, These nonprofit entities generally intend to accomplish this mission by
making the City safer and more welcoming for residents and visitors, ensuring and
maintaining clean public spaces, increasing foot traffic for local businesses, enhancing cultural
and arts programming, using financial resources to support local businesses and projects, and
researching and implementing other measures aimed at revitalizing the City and its downtown
area, including projects in partnership with the City and projects that may become owned or
maintained by the City; and

WHEREAS, These nonprofit entities are fundraising for these efforts, and the City is
 generally supportive of these efforts and their potential; and

WHEREAS, In the past, the City has collaborated with other nonprofit organizations,
 private entities, grantmakers, foundations, and other entities, including through contracts or
 grants or permits; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor seeks a six-month waiver of the City's Behested Payment 15 16 Ordinance (Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, Section 3.600 et seq.) on his own 17 behalf, and on behalf of the Mayor's Chief of Staff, Chief of Infrastructure, Climate and 18 Mobility, Chief of Housing and Economic Development, Chief of Public Health, Homelessness, and Family Services, Chief of Public Safety, Policy Advisor, Director of 19 20 Community Affairs, Assistant Chiefs of Climate and Mobility, Assistant Chiefs of Housing and 21 Economic Development, Assistant Chiefs of Health, Homelessness, and Family Services, 22 Assistant Chiefs of Public Safety, and the Director of the City's Office of Economic and 23 Workforce Development (OEWD), to the extent it restricts or prohibits any of them from soliciting financial support or in-kind goods or services for nonprofit entities working to 24 25 revitalize San Francisco's downtown; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office and OEWD have agreed to report to the Board of
Supervisors donations that were solicited under this waiver, identifying the donors and the
amounts donated and the interested party relationship the donor has with the Mayor's Office
or OEWD, and will submit this report to the Board within 60 days of the expiration of the sixmonth period authorized by this waiver; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That under Section 3.620(f) of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct 7 Code, the Board of Supervisors hereby waives application of the Behested Payment 8 Ordinance as to the Mayor and as to the Mayor's Chief of Staff, Chief of Infrastructure, 9 Climate and Mobility, Chief of Housing and Economic Development, Chief of Public Health, 10 Homelessness, and Family Services, Chief of Public Safety, Policy Advisor, Director of Community Affairs, Assistant Chiefs of Climate and Mobility, Assistant Chiefs of Housing and 11 12 Economic Development, Assistant Chiefs of Health, Homelessness, and Family Services, 13 Assistant Chiefs of Public Safety, and the Director of the City's Office of Economic and 14 Workforce Development (OEWD), for six months from the effective date of this Resolution, to 15 solicitations of financial support or in-kind goods or services from nonprofits, private 16 organizations, grantmakers, foundations, and other persons and entities to support the work 17 of nonprofit entities to help revitalize San Francisco including its downtown area; and, be it 18 FURTHER RESOLVED, That granting this waiver serves the public interest by helping 19 revitalize San Francisco, to make San Francisco including its downtown area a better place to 20 live, work, play, visit, and conduct business, now and in the months and years to come; and, 21 be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That granting this waiver does not create an appearance of 22 23 impropriety.

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
