

[Accept-Expend State Grant]

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2 **Resolution authorizing the Mayor’s Office of Criminal Justice (MOCJ) to accept and**
3 **expend funds in the amount of \$1,913,199 from the State Corrections Standards**
4 **Authority (CSA), from funds made available under Senate Bill 736 – known as the**
5 **Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA) – for programs and approaches that**
6 **have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency, for the period of July**
7 **1, 2006 to June 30, 2007.**

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9 WHEREAS, MOCJ is the lead programmatic and fiscal agency of the county in
10 administering JJCPA, which provides funds for the county to implement a comprehensive,
11 multi-agency juvenile justice plan; and

12 WHEREAS, the JJCPA requires that the county’s local Juvenile Justice Coordinating
13 Council, whose membership is described in Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions
14 Code, update its Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile Justice Plan (also know as its
15 Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan) and develop an annual expenditure plan for JJCPA funds;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, JJCPA also requires that the county Board of Supervisors, and in the case
18 of a city and county the Mayor, approve the updated Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile
19 Justice Plan and the JJCPA expenditure plan; and

20 WHEREAS, the City originally established the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council
21 through resolution 170-97; and

22 WHEREAS, the Chief Probation Officer, William P. Siffermann, serves as chair of the
23 Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council as required by JJCPA and Section 749.22 of the
24 Welfare and Institutions Code; and

1 WHEREAS, on April 6, 2006 the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council met and
2 recommended to the Board of Supervisors the updated Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile
3 Justice Plan and the expenditure plan for the 2006 allocation of the JJCPA grant; and

4 WHEREAS, on June 13, 2006 the Board of Supervisors approved resolution number
5 362-06 to accept and expend an initial allocation of one-fourth of this award, equaling
6 \$560,738; and

7 WHEREAS, the grant does not require an ASO amendment; and

8 WHEREAS, the grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs of \$9,566 (the
9 maximum amount allowed by the state); now, therefore be it

10 RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes MOCJ to
11 accept and expend \$1,913,199 from the State Corrections Standards Authority under JJCPA
12 for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing
13 delinquency; and

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all interest earned and prior year unencumbered funds
15 of this grant is appropriated to support approved 2006 JJCPA programs;

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County assures that the Board of Supervisors
17 has reviewed and approves the county's update to the Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile
18 Justice Plan; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice
20 is authorized to sign the application for approval submitted to the Corrections Standards
21 Authority; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco assures that it
23 has adhered to the requirements of JJCPA and of the Corrections Standards Authority
24 regarding the submission of the plan; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan has been developed and provided to the
2 Corrections Standards Authority in a format determined by the Corrections Standards
3 Authority regarding submission of the Plan; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco, upon
5 approval from the Corrections Standards Authority, will adhere to the requirements of the
6 JJCPA regarding the expenditure of JJCPA funds and the submission of required Corrections
7 Standards Authority reports.
