3 **Motion authorizing preparation of written Proponent and Opponent ballot arguments**
4 **and rebuttal ballot arguments for submittal to the voters for the November 5, 2019,**
5 **Consolidated Municipal Election.**

7 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors wishes to authorize the listed Board Member(s)
8 or sponsor, supporting the following ballot measure(s), to prepare and submit a written
9 proponent ballot argument(s) and proponent rebuttal argument(s) for submittal to the Director
10 of Elections:

- 11 ▪ Charter Amendment (First Draft) to amend the Charter of the City and County of
12 San Francisco to change the name of the Aging and Adult Services Commission to
13 the Disability and Aging Services Commission, and establish qualifications for three
14 of the Commission seats; change the name of the Department of Aging and Adult
15 Services to the Department of Disability and Aging Services; and to change the
16 name of the Aging and Adult Services Community Living Fund to the Disability and
17 Aging Services Community Living Fund; at an election to be held on November 5,
18 2019. (Board File No. 190570) (Supervisors Yee, Haney, Fewer, Mar, Walton)
