

1 [Emergency Ordinance - Protections for Occupants of Residential Hotels During COVID-19  
2 Pandemic]

3 **Reenactment of emergency ordinance (Ordinance No. 84-20, reenacted and amended**  
4 **by Ordinance No. 161-20) to establish protections for occupants of residential hotels**  
5 **(“SRO Residents”) during the COVID-19 pandemic by, among other things: making it**  
6 **City policy to place in solitary hotel rooms SRO residents who meet the criteria for**  
7 **isolation or quarantine established by the County Health Officer, and requiring the**  
8 **Department of Public Health to: develop a protocol to assist health care providers to**  
9 **identify SRO Residents who may require protection against or treatment for COVID-19;**  
10 **notify the operator of a residential hotel when an SRO Resident has tested positive for**  
11 **COVID-19, to facilitate contact tracing, testing for COVID-19, and cleaning; establish a**  
12 **telephone hotline for SRO Residents, to respond to questions about accessing COVID-**  
13 **19 health screenings, testing, and solitary hotel rooms; provide face coverings to SRO**  
14 **Residents and workers in residential hotels; and provide daily aggregate data**  
15 **concerning the incidence of COVID-19 among SRO Residents, access to quarantine**  
16 **rooms by such residents, and the number of such residents who have died due to**  
17 **complications from COVID-19.**

25 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Declaration of Emergency Pursuant to Charter Section 2.107.

1 (a) Section 2.107 of the Charter authorizes passage of an emergency ordinance in  
2 cases of public emergency affecting life, health, or property, or for the uninterrupted operation  
3 of any City or County department or office required to comply with time limitations established  
4 by law. An emergency ordinance enacted under Charter Section 2.107 automatically  
5 terminates on the 61st day after passage, but may be reenacted upon the same terms and  
6 conditions applicable to its initial enactment.

7 (b) Pursuant to Charter Section 2.107, the City enacted Ordinance No. 84-20, an  
8 emergency ordinance, which temporarily established protections for occupants of residential  
9 hotels (“SRO Residents”) during the COVID-19 pandemic. The emergency ordinance became  
10 effective when enacted, on May 29, 2020. On September 11, 2020, Ord. No. 84-20 was  
11 reenacted by another emergency ordinance, Ord. No. 161-20, and amended to address the  
12 City’s duty to post information in residential hotels concerning the rights of residents to access  
13 services related to COVID-19. Ord. No. 161-20 will terminate automatically on November 11,  
14 2020, unless reenacted.

15 (c) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the findings declared in Section 1 of  
16 Ordinance No. 84-20 and reaffirmed in Section 1 of Ord. No. 161-20 remain valid and  
17 compelling, and declares further that an actual emergency continues to exist that requires the  
18 reenactment of Ordinance No. 84-20, as amended by Ord. No. 161-20, to reduce the spread  
19 of COVID-19. COVID-19 continues to present an extremely dangerous public health risk to  
20 the residents of residential hotels and to individuals who work in residential hotels.

22 Section 2. Reenactment of Emergency Ordinance. Consistent with Charter Section  
23 2.107, this emergency ordinance reenacts for an additional 60 days the emergency ordinance  
24 providing temporary protections to occupants of residential hotels (Ordinance No. 84-20), as  
25 amended by Ord. 161-20.
