11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
12	Section 1. The San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code is hereby
13	amended by adding a new Chapter 6 to Article III, and by adding sections 3.600, 3.605 and
14	3.610 to read as follows:
15	CHAPTER 6: REIMBURSEMENT TO THE CITY FOR CAMPAIGN-RELATED TRAVEL BY
16	ELECTED OFFICIALS.
17	Section 3.600. Reimbursement to City.
18	(a) Whenever the City and County of San Francisco provides personal security to a City
19	elective officer traveling outside the City, and the officer engages in any campaign-related activity or
20	meeting during the travel, the officer and the City department expending funds to provide security to
21	the officer shall take all the steps prescribed in this Section.
22	(1) Within 15 days of the travel, the City elective officer shall deliver to the City department
23	expending funds to provide security a schedule including all of the officer's activities and meetings
24	during the period when the officer was outside the City, indicating the amount of time the officer spent
25	on each activity or meeting and whether each activity or meeting was campaign-related.

1	(2) The City department expending funds to provide security shall, within 15 days of receiving
2	the schedule described in subsection (a)(1), provide the officer a bill for the funds expended by the City
3	for security in association with the travel. The bill shall include the total cost of base salary, benefits,
4	overtime pay, per diem payments, transportation, meals and all other expenses for security personnel
5	travelling with the elective officer. The bill shall include an itemized accounting of costs unless the
6	City department providing the bill determines that disclosure of an itemized accounting would
7	undermine the security of the City elective officer.
8	(3) Within 15 days of receiving a bill from the City described in subsection (a)(2), the City
9	elective officer shall reimburse the City for the total cost of security provided in connection with
10	campaign-related activities and meetings, or arrange for such reimbursement by a third party.
11	(4) Within 15 days of receiving a bill from the City described in subsection (a)(2), the City
12	elective officer shall file with the Ethics Commission a copy of the bill described in Subsection (a)(1);
13	the schedule described in Subsection (a)(2); and a report documenting the amount of the
14	reimbursement, the person making the reimbursement, the date of the travel, and any other information
15	required by the Ethics Commission.
16	(b) Definitions. For the purpose of this Section, the following words and phrases shall mean:
17	(1) "Campaign-related activity or meeting" shall mean any activity or meeting with the purpose
18	of advocating for the election or defeat of a candidate for City, State or Federal elective office, or
19	raising funds for such a candidate.
20	(2) "The cost of security provided in connection with campaign-related activities and meetings"
21	shall mean the product of (i) the total amount expended by the City for security for the reported travel
22	and (ii) the percentage of time in the officer's schedule devoted to campaign-related activities or
23	meetings. To determine the percentage of time in the officer's schedule devoted to campaign-related
24	activities, the officer shall take the total amount of time spent on campaign-related activities and
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1	meetings, including the time spent in transit to and from such activities and meetings, and divide that
2	figure by the total amount of time spent on all activities and meetings in the officer's schedule.
3	3.605. Forms and Regulations. The Ethics Commission shall specify the form and content of
4	all forms and statements required to be filed under this Chapter. The Ethics Commission also may
5	adopt regulations to implement this Chapter under Charter Section 15.102.
6	3.610. Enforcement and Penalties.
7	(a) Criminal penalties. Any person who willfully violates Section 6.100 of this Chapter shall be
8	guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than
9	\$1,000 for each violation or by imprisonment in the County jail for a period of not more than six
10	months or by both such fine and imprisonment.
11	(b) Civil penalties. Any person who willfully or negligently violates Section 6.100 of this
12	Chapter shall be liable in a civil action brought by the City Attorney for an amount up to \$1,000 for
13	each violation.
14	(c) Administrative penalties. Any person who willfully or negligently violates Section 6.100 of
15	this Chapter shall be liable in an administrative proceeding before the Ethics Commission held
16	pursuant to the Charter, and shall be subject to the administrative orders and penalties authorized
17	therein. In addition to the administrative orders and penalties set forth in the Charter, the person shall
18	be liable for the cost of the Ethics Commission's investigation. The Ethics Commission also may issue
19	warning letters to City elective officers.
