3	Ordinance amending the San Francisco Administrative Code by adding Section 7.20, to
4	require all City public information officers to attend annual training in emergency
5	communications to be provided by the Department of Emergency Management,
6	require the Department of Emergency Management to prepare a plan for coordinating
7	and directing the activities of public information officers during a local emergency, and
8	restate the responsibilities of public information officers as disaster service workers.

12	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
13	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding
14	Section 7.20, to read as follows:
15	SEC. 7.20. EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS TRAINING FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION
16	OFFICERS.
17	(a) All persons employed by the City as public information officers shall sign an annual
18	affidavit or declaration stating under penalty of perjury that they have attended or will attend when
19	next offered, a training session on emergency communications, to be held at least once annually. The
20	affidavit or declarations shall be maintained by the Department of Human Resources and shall be
21	available as a public record. The Department of Emergency Management, Division of Emergency
22	Services Annual shall provide the annual training sessions on emergency communications, either
23	directly or through a provider approved by the Department.
24	(b) No later than May 1, 2008, the Department of Emergency Management, Division of
25	Emergency Services, shall prepare and submit a plan for coordinating and directing the activities of

1	<u>departmental public information officers during a local emergency. The Division of Emergency</u>
2	Services shall submit the plan to the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, and the Disaster Council for
3	their review and comments.
4	(c) Public information officers are, by virtue of their employment with the City, also disaster
5	service workers and during a declared state of local emergency may be required to serve as such on
6	days and at times other than their normal work schedules.
