For the past two and a half years, I have served as a research assistant with the UCSF San Francisco Injury Center (SFIC) conducting research on public health strategies to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety in San Francisco. I have worked extensively studying injury prevention with Dr. Rochelle Dicker, executive director of the San Francisco Injury Center, Dahianna Lopez, RN, MSN, MPH, the former vice chair of the Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee (PSAC), and Abigail Evans, the former public health seat member of the PSAC committee. As a native of the San Francisco Bay Area, I hope to serve on the public health seat of the PSAC committee because I am committed to making San Francisco a safe and pedestrian bicycle-friendly city. With pedestrian injury being the 5th leading cause of trauma admissions in San Francisco, the need for policy actions and improved infrastructure is essential, for pedestrian safety is paramount to the overall health of the community. As a member of the PSAC committee, I hope to serve as a bridge by translating current public health research into real policy actions and ensure that the general public feels safe commuting by walking and bicycling. I am committed to making a difference and I am excited to have the opportunity to serve the San Francisco community.

Business and/or professional experience:

As a research assistant at the UCSF San Francisco Injury Center since June 2010, I have been involved in the public health realm of pedestrian and bicycle safety in San Francisco for two and a half years. Under the direction of Dr. Rochelle Dicker and Dahianna Lopez, I have conducted extensive research on pedestrian and bicycle injury and have been involved in building community relationships with San Francisco organizations such as the SF Bicycle Coalition and Walk SF. I have also attended and participated in meetings with the San Francisco Department of Public Health to discuss and develop strategies to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety, and I have also attended SF Board of Supervisors hearings related to pedestrian and bicycle issues. As a public health researcher, I have studied the indirect economic cost of pedestrian injury in San Francisco, and I recently published a journal article on the need for using trauma center data to identify missing bicycle injuries to ensure proper allocation of funds and attention on bicycling in different parts of the city. My qualifications also extend beyond my experiences. I am a dedicated, responsible and committed individual and I am enthusiastic about making a difference in pedestrian and bicycle safety through policy.

Civic Activities:

Outside of the realm of public health research, I am also interested in health disparities, youth development and elder welfare. From June 2011 to September 2012, I acted as a coordinator for the UCSF Empowerment Center, which is program under the UCSF Wraparound Project that serves to empower violently injured youth in San Francisco by exposing them to higher education, government, community health, and more. Currently, I am also serving in the realm of youth development as an Americorps and Bonner leader, building and facilitating a peer mentorship program in one of Richmond's highest-need high schools. At the University of California Berkeley, I serve as the president of Bears for Elder Welfare, a service organization that strives to promote healthy aging and volunteerism in senior centers and elder communities. Finally, an aspiring physician, I also currently serve as a volunteer with the San Francisco General Hospital emergency department to improve and facilitate access to immediate health care.



Administrative Code Sections 5.20 and 5.21. (Ordinance 85-02). Ordinance 127-07 reconstituted the membership. Ordinance 287-08.

Board Qualifications:

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall consist of twenty-three (23) voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint twenty-one members from the following categories: two representatives from pedestrian safety organizations; two representatives from a senior or disability organization; one representative from bicycle or other non-motorized wheeled personal transport organization; one representative from transit or environmental organization; one representative from child advocate or school support organizations; one representative from a public health organization; two at-large representatives; eleven (11) persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board shall appoint a representative who resides in his or her district.

The Superintendent of Schools shall appoint two members, one of whom shall be a student and one of whom shall be a parent.

In addition to the twenty-three voting members, the following City Departments shall select a non-voting representative: Public Health; Municipal Transportation Agency; Public Works; Planning; Police; Recreation and Parks; District Attorney's Office; the Mayor's Office on Disability; and any other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians.

Advisory Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. In addition, an Advisory Committee member's term shall expire by operation of law upon the

issuance by the clerk of the Committee a notification adopted by the Advisory Committee certifying that the member in question has three consecutive unexcused absences from meetings of the Advisory Committee.

The term of each Advisory Committee member shall be two years. However, half of the members will serve an initial one year term and half will serve a two year term to be determined by lot.

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall (1) Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and other City departments in order to improve pedestrian safety and ambiance; (2) Develop concepts and review policies and planning efforts regarding pedestrian improvements; (3) Make recommendations on funding opportunities and priorities; (4) Review and make recommendations on policies and programs related to pedestrians in the Transportation Element of the Master Plan of the City and County of San Francisco; (5) Support the development of a Pedestrian Master Plan.

The Board of Supervisors urged the Municipal Transportation Agency to support the Advisory Committee with funding and staff resources and to present a monthly interdepartmental report to the Advisory Committee.

Report: The Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrians injury and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for changes in policies, funding and enforcement, and other pertinent issues.

Within six months of the appointment of members of the Advisory Committee as newly constituted by File No. 070082, the Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors, in writing, as to the number of meetings for which the Advisory Committee has had a quorum.
