Resolution urging the Ethics Commission to conduct a public hearing and develop and present to the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors and other City elective officeholders recommended procedures for: screening applicants to City commissions and for at-will employment; training City commissioners and staff regarding City conflict-of-interest and Sunshine requirements; and additional policies to maintain ethical conduct.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is governed by the following elective offices: Mayor, Board of Supervisors, City Attorney, District Attorney, Assessor-Recorder, Public Defender, Sheriff and Treasurer; and

WHEREAS, Effective transition from one officeholder to another, including screening applicants for at-will employment and training City commissioners and staff regarding City conflict-of-interest and Sunshine requirements, is critical to the operation of City government; and

WHEREAS. The City Attorney currently publishes the "Overview of the Laws Governing the Conduct of Public Officials";

WHEREAS, The current administration has employed Citywide trainings to provide ethics, conflict-of-interest and Sunshine training to City commissioners;

WHEREAS. The Ethics Commission is currently undertaking an exhaustive review of City conflict-of-interest provisions that may yield a proposal for voter consideration; and

WHEREAS, In November 2003, San Francisco voters will elect a Mayor and District Attorney; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Ethics Commission to conduct a public hearing for the purpose of developing and presenting to the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors and other City elective officeholders recommended procedures for the following:

- (a) screening applicants to City commissions and for at-will employment;
- (b) training City commissioners and staff regarding City conflict-of-interest and Sunshine requirements; and
- (c) additional policies to maintain ethical conduct, including department-specific recommendations; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors hereby urges Ethics Commission to present its recommendations to the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors and other City elective officeholders by November 10, 2003; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Ethics Commission to invite good government groups including, but not limited to Common Cause, the League of Women Voters and the Center for Governmental Studies to provide comment on these issues.
