Authorizing the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council (MCJC) to accept and \$2,831<u>,068</u> expend funds in the amount of \$2,831,103 from the State Board of Corrections, from funds made available under Assembly Bill 1913 – known as the Schiff-Cardenas Crime Prevention Act of 2000 (CPA 2000), for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency. as amended by the Board.

WHEREAS, MCJC is the lead programmatic and fiscal agency for the county in administering CPA 2000, which provides funds for the county to implement a comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan; and

WHEREAS, CPA 2000 requires that the county's local juvenile justice coordinating council, whose membership is described in Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, update its Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan and develop an expenditure plan for CPA 2000; and

WHEREAS, CPA 2000 also requires that the county Board of Supervisors, and in the case of a city and county the Mayor, approve the updated juvenile justice local action plan and the CPA 2000 expenditure plan; and

WHEREAS, the City originally established the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council through resolution 170-97; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Probation Officer, Jesse Williams, as required by CPA 2000 and Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, serves as the chair of the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council; and

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2001 the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, chaired by the Chief Probation Officer, met and recommended to the Board of Supervisors the expenditure plan for CPA 2000; and

WHEREAS, the positions authorized under the grant are designated as "G" or "Grant Funded" positions which would terminate when the grant expires; and

WHEREAS, all funds provided through CPA 2000 are for direct services to youth, it is requested that indirect costs be waived; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes \$2,831,068.

MCJC to accept and expend \$2,831,103 from the State Board of Corrections, under CPA 2000 for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County assures that the Board of Supervisors has reviewed and approves the county's Comprehensive Multiagency Juvenile Justice Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Mayor's Criminal

Justice Council is authorized to sign the application for approval submitted to the

Board of Corrections; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco assures that it has adhered to the requirements of CPA 2000 and of the Board of Corrections regarding the submission of the plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan has been developed and provided to the Board of Corrections in a format determined by the Board of Corrections regarding submission of the Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco, upon approval from the Board of Corrections, will adhere to the requirements of the CPA 2000 regarding the expenditure of CPA 2000 funds and the submission of required Board of Corrections reports; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the programs approved for funding through this resolution are hereby amended by deleting the \$159,056 funding for the 2.3 FTE's 8444 Deputy Probation Officers, and transferring those funds to the Intensive Home Based Supervision Program, the funds for that program now being \$259,056.
