4	adding section 16.5 to create an official holiday for March 31 st , the birthday of Cesar

8	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
9	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding
0	Chapter 16, Article 1, Section 16.5, to read as follows:
1	Sec. 16.5. Cesar Chavez Day. (a) March 31st shall be a holiday, known as "Cesar
2	Chavez Day."
3	(b) This section shall create a paid holiday for represented employees of the City and
4	County of San Francisco only to the extent allowed by ratified Memoranda of Understanding
5	between the City and the affected recognized employee organizations. This section will not
6	create a paid holiday for City employees until funds have been allocated for such a holiday.
7	(c) The process for establishing a paid holiday for City employees is the following:
8	(1) For employees represented by an employee organization whose labor
9	contract (Memorandum of Understanding, or MOU) contains the following, or a similar,
20	<u>provision</u>
21	"[A]ny day declared to be a holiday by proclamation of the Mayor after
22	such day has heretofore been declared a holiday by the Governoror the President"
23	the Mayor may, by proclamation, provide a paid holiday for those employees covered by the
24	MOU.
25	(2) For employees represented by an employee organization whose MOU does

1	not contain the language included in subparagraph (1) above, or if the Mayor does not
2	exercise her or his authority under the language in subparagraph (1) above, the Mayor,
3	through the Department of Human Resources, may meet and confer with employee
4	representatives and propose an amendment to the MOU that will provide a paid holiday for
5	those employees covered by the MOU. Such a proposed MOU amendment, if agreed upon
6	by the labor organization and the Mayor, must be approved, or rejected, by the Board of
7	Supervisors, and would become effective the following fiscal year.
8	(3) For employees who are not represented by an employee organization, the
9	City, by an ordinance approved by the Board of Supervisors, may amend the Unrepresented
10	Employees Ordinance to provide an additional paid holiday for unrepresented City employees
