This letter is a supplement to my application to sit in at Seat #3 representing senior and disabled San Franciscans on the Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee submitted to Lisa Wong March 2013.

Supervisors David Chiu and Scott Weiner can attest to my passion to promote pedestrian safety in San Francisco. I bring the insight of a survivor. In May of 2010 I survived with a permanent traumatic brain injury by an SUV as a pedestrian on Market Street. This experience has compelled me to be of service in any capacity to diminish the danger I have faced which endangers approximately 800 precious lives each year. I have attended many of the monthly meetings of PSAC in the last three years. I comprehend the repercussion of trauma to the body, minds, and spirits of those of us who are injured. These injuries ripple into the families and friends of those injured.

Practicing architecture for over twenty five years, I have a professional knowledge of the built environment of urban streets. In addition to understanding cities from architectural work I know cities as a resident. All my adult life I have lived in cities including New York, Washington DC, New Haven CT. and Philadelphia, PA. before moving to San Francisco fifteen years ago.

I am a strong advocate for seniors and those of us with disabilities. I am keenly aware of the call for legible signals and coherent pedestrian pathways throughout our city to people who navigate the city streets with visual, audio, cognitive, physical disabilities. My daily work facilitating art with senior and disabled San Franciscan gives me a profound lived understanding of the diverse concerns of disabled pedestrian walking through the city. I am conscious of the myriad of detailed factors essential to coherent safe pedestrian pathways. I work with seniors as a consulting therapeutic art instructor at Rhoda Goldman Plaza, Alma Via and Vintage Coventry assisted living communities, On Lok and SteppingStone Adult Day Health Care. I provide accommodation to mentally and physically disabled seniors daily in the course of teaching and facilitating art with them. I am a member of the St. Mary's Hospital Traumatic Brain Injury Support Group.

Our San Francisco community needs to work to establish safety in our streets. Through my life and work experiences I am equipped and committed to this work to fully represent senior disability organizations on the Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee on Seat # 3!

Administrative Code Sections 5.20 and 5.21. (Ordinance 85-02). Ordinance 127-07 reconstituted the membership. Ordinance 287-08.

Board Qualifications:

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall consist of twenty-three (23) voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint twenty-one members from the following categories: two representatives from pedestrian safety organizations; two representatives from a senior or disability organization; one representative from bicycle or other non-motorized wheeled personal transport organization; one representative from transit or environmental organization; one representative from child advocate or school support organizations; one representative from a public health organization; two at-large representatives; eleven (11) persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board shall appoint a representative who resides in his or her district.

The Superintendent of Schools shall appoint two members, one of whom shall be a student and one of whom shall be a parent.

In addition to the twenty-three voting members, the following City Departments shall select a non-voting representative: Public Health; Municipal Transportation Agency; Public Works; Planning; Police; Recreation and Parks; District Attorney's Office; the Mayor's Office on Disability; and any other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians.

Advisory Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. In addition, an Advisory Committee member's term shall expire by operation of law upon the

issuance by the clerk of the Committee a notification adopted by the Advisory Committee certifying that the member in question has three consecutive unexcused absences from meetings of the Advisory Committee.

The term of each Advisory Committee member shall be two years. However, half of the members will serve an initial one year term and half will serve a two year term to be determined by lot.

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall (1) Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and other City departments in order to improve pedestrian safety and ambiance; (2) Develop concepts and review policies and planning efforts regarding pedestrian improvements; (3) Make recommendations on funding opportunities and priorities; (4) Review and make recommendations on policies and programs related to pedestrians in the Transportation Element of the Master Plan of the City and County of San Francisco; (5) Support the development of a Pedestrian Master Plan.

The Board of Supervisors urged the Municipal Transportation Agency to support the Advisory Committee with funding and staff resources and to present a monthly interdepartmental report to the Advisory Committee.

Report: The Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrians injury and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for changes in policies, funding and enforcement, and other pertinent issues.

Within six months of the appointment of members of the Advisory Committee as newly constituted by File No. 070082, the Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors, in writing, as to the number of meetings for which the Advisory Committee has had a quorum.
