| 15     | Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 2A.240, to  |

- Develop and keep current an annual statement of purpose outlining its areas of jurisdiction, authorities, purpose and goals, subject to review and approval by the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors;
   Recommend to the Mayor for submission to the Board of Supervisors rates, fees and similar charges with respect to appropriate items coming within its jurisdiction;
   Prepare and recommend to the Mayor an annual budget for the Commission's
  - 4. Prepare and recommend to the Mayor an annual budget for the Commission's activities;
  - 5. Oversee grants and programs concerning and benefiting small businesses and neighborhood business districts;
  - 6. Review all legislation affecting small businesses and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors;
    - 7. Declare one month out of the year Small Business Month;
  - 8. Establish an application and selection process to provide recognition during at least one public event during Small Business Month to outstanding local small businesses that contribute to the vitality of San Francisco. Solicitation for honorees shall come from the Mayor, individual members of the Board of Supervisors, individual members of the Commission, and the general public; During Small Business Month, coordinate activities to encourage the general public to support San Francisco small businesses;
  - 9. Review rules and regulations adopted by City departments that affect small businesses and recommend modifications that would promote the health of small businesses;
  - 10. Collect and analyze information about the small business economy in San Francisco, as well as conduct investigations under its power of inquiry into any aspect of governmental operations affecting small businesses, including holding hearings and taking testimony, and make recommendations to the Mayor or the Board of Supervisors; and
