1	(b) Beginning with fiscal year 2003-2004, fees set in this Section may be			
2	adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in			
3	the relevant Consumer Price Index, as determined by the Controller.			
4	No later than April 15 th of each year, the Medical Examiner's Office shall submit			
5	its current fee schedule to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to			
6	produce a new fee schedule for the following year.			
7	No later than May 15 th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the			
8	Board of Supervisors reporting the new fee schedule and certifying that: (a) the fees produce			
9	sufficient revenue to support the costs of providing the services for which each fee is			
10	assessed, and (b) the fees do not produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs			
11	of providing the services for which each fee is assessed.			
12	(c) All fees received for documents and services mentioned in this Section			
13	shall be deposited with the Treasurer and shall be used to defray the costs incurred by the			
14	Medical Examiner in issuing such documents or providing such services.
