WHEREAS, Thousands of other families composed of U.S. citizens and immigrants, face separation because of INS deportations every year, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urge the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) to do what is necessary so that this family can be reunited; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the INS and the Department of Justice change their procedures and rules so that similar separations do not occur in the future.
