8	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
9	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending
10	Section 10.100-114, as follows:
11	Sec. 10.100-114 MAYOR'S NEIGHBORHOOD BEAUTIFICATION AND GRAFFITI
12	CLEAN-UP FUND.
13	(a) Findings. The proliferation of graffiti on public buildings and other public property
14	has created a blight which offends both citizens of and visitors to San Francisco. The removal
15	of such graffiti will enhance the beauty of the City in which we live and will encourage others
16	to visit and to relocate here. Removal will thus both reflect and renew our civic pride and
17	contribute to our economic viability. Providing a source of funds for the promotion of
18	neighborhood beautification projects will support the efforts of local residents and businesses
19	to improve the quality of life for San Francisco residents and the local economy, and assist in
20	reducing the amount of graffiti in San Francisco.
21	(b) Statement of Intent. The Board of Supervisors wishes to address the above
22	concerns by establishing a neighborhood beautification and graffiti clean-up fund which will
23	promote neighborhood beautification projects, including projects designed to improve the
24	environmental quality of neighborhoods, and finance the clean-up of graffiti on public property

- 1 (c) Establishment of Fund. The *Mayor's* Neighborhood Beautification and Graffiti Clean2 Up Fund is established as a category four fund for the purpose of receiving all donations or
 3 grants of money which may be collected by the City and County of San Francisco for the
 4 purposes noted in (b).
 5 (d) Use of Fund. The fund shall be used exclusively for the purposes enumerated in
 - (d) Use of Fund. The fund shall be used exclusively for the purposes enumerated in (b), provided that such expenditures shall include reimbursement to City and County departments for expenses incurred in the administration of the fund.
 - (e) Administration of Fund. The *Mayor City Administrator*, *or his or her designee*, shall have the following duties in regard to administration of the fund:
 - 1. The *Mayor City Administrator*, or his or her designee, shall be responsible for the administration of the Neighborhood Beautification and Graffiti Clean-Up Fund, and shall have all such authority as may be reasonably necessary to carry out those responsibilities.
 - 2. The *Mayor City Administrator* shall promulgate such rules and regulations as he or she may deem appropriate to carry out the provisions of this section. Before issuing or amending any rules and regulations, the Mayor shall provide a 30-day public comment period by providing published notice in an official newspaper of general circulation in the City of the intent to issue or amend the rules and regulations. The rules and regulations shall be approved by resolution of the Board of Supervisors. Such rules and regulations shall include, but not be limited to, the qualifications of applicants and factors to be considered in the award of grants to fund programs to help remove graffiti and promote neighborhood beautification projects, including preference for the following projects: youth programs and innovation, projects that are neighborhood generated, and projects designed to benefit areas of San Francisco that are economically disadvantaged.

1	3. The Mayor City Administrator shall submit a semiannual report to the Board of
2	Supervisors setting forth an accounting of the amounts disbursed and the uses for which said
3	funds were made.
