While attending San Francisco State University, twenty one year old Steven Lee created Steven Lee Productions to explored and experience the nightclub, bar and entertainment industry. He rented venues and formatted the music for over 100 large capacity events, four clubs and dozen of five star hotels in San Francisco. He quickly compiled a database of over 8,000 patrons that could be informed of any event in the future. He designed and printed the flyers, peeled the label, licked the stamped and went to the post office.

Within a few years, Steven went into booking and managing several top 40's dance bands, produced a concert with a #1 top Sony recording group The Jets, and organized three San Francisco / Los Angeles party tour to Hawaii, (aka Tri-city convention) fifty to one hundred people attended. 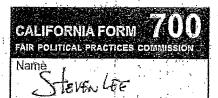

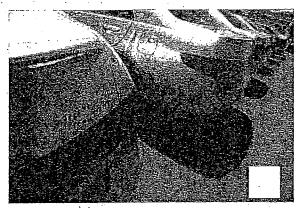


Parking latest target of San Francisco clubs crackdown

Parking lots are the latest target of efforts to quell late-night violence associated with clubgoers that's plagued The City for the past few years.

Shootings, stabbings, fights and other violence involving nightclub patrons prompted officials to crack down on entertainment venues with measures such as requiring promoters to register with The City and giving the Entertainment Commission authority to revoke the permits of troublesome clubs.

Now new legislation expected to be introduced

Tuesday would require parking lots near nightclubs to take some responsibility in late-night safety measures. Board of Supervisors President David Chiu and Supervisor Scott Wiener drafted the legislation with help from City Attorney Dennis Herrera.

"We're asking [parking lot] operators to stand up and make sure The City is safe," Chiu said.

"Oftentimes patrons leave clubs and congregate in the parking lots and violence tends to happen.

Club owners have done their part, it's time to ask lots to help make this city safer."

If approved, parking lots and garages within 1,000 feet of a nightclub would be required to enhance lighting in entrances, doorways and stairwells. Staff would have to be on site until 3 a.m. Operators would be required to comply when applying for annual permits. The City Attorney's Office would be able to issue civil penalties for noncompliance.

Currently, few parking lot personnel are on site when clubs close for the night, according to Chiu.

The legislation is in reaction to violence associated with nightclubs over the past several years. The most violent incidents have occurred outside venues after hours.

Steven Lee, owner of the Glass Kat in South of Market, said his security guards will often walk patrons to their cars as a safety precaution, but that can create additional problems.

"At 2 a.m. when we let out, there's no one in the lots who can help us; we're on private property," Lee said. "It can be too far away. So then we have to call police for help."

Last year, police recommended club owners install cameras, metal detectors and ID scanners to combat violence. That legislation has not been approved.

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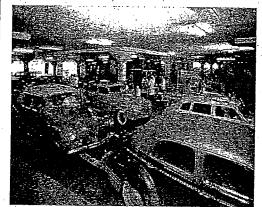

Bands of hooligans are hanging out in San Francisco parking lots, and that needs to stop, say supervisors David Chiu, Scott Weiner and City Attomey Dennis Herrera.

They've crafted legislation that will require parking lot owners to make their asphalt lots and garages more secure, brighter and, in some cases, staffed later.

The issue, the three say, is that bands of young ruffians (they didn't use that phrase, but boy we wish they did) spend their evenings hanging out in vacant parking lots usually filled with commuter cars. When they interact with revelers leaving nightclubs, hijinks ensue.

This upsets club owners, who say they are getting unfairly blamed for the parking-lot revelry.

"Something we should not be putting on the entertainment industry is a responsibility to deal with our society's violence issues," Wiener said.

The law will require that parking lots and garages submit a security plan, which may require them to improve lighting or fencing. Those within 1,000 feet of an entertainment establishment will be required to have a security guard or attendant on duty until 3 a.m. The legislation will be formally introduced Tuesday.

"This will send a message to the people outside of San Francisco who come here to a nightclub or bar that they will be safe," said Steven Lee, the general manager of the Glas Kat nightclub.

But parking lot operators, aren't so sure they like the idea.

"They want us to do what?" Tahir Zira, the owner of American West Parking said when we told him about the proposed law. "How can you keep the people there until 3 a.m., you have to pay them? That's crazy. That makes no sense."

Zira, who owns six lots throughout the city, said he wasn't sure it was safe for his attendants to sit in the their little booths that late at night. Crime can be a problem, but not his problem, he said.

"Whatever they say is a good for the city," he said referring to city officials," I think it is not good."

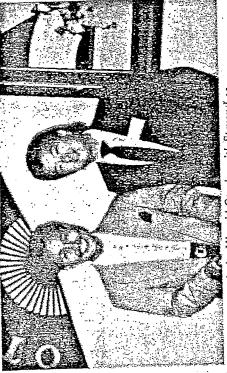

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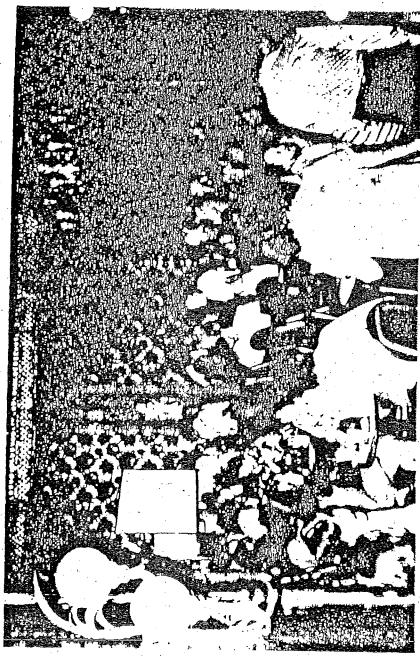

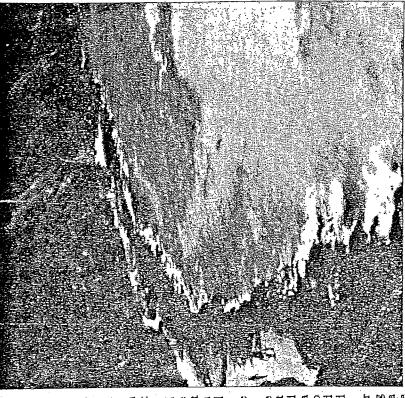

In the past seven years Steven Lee has thrown more than 30 parties and some 17,000 people have shown up. One party even took place at the Pacific Beach Hotel in Honolulu.

"Well, I do it because there's a certain amount of profit," the executive producer of Party Crowd Production grinned. "And it's something I like to do."
Lee started holding dance

Lee started holding dance functions when he was a student at San Francisco State University, and gradually made a name for himself among the "party crowd." The entertainment agency that he formed then has since expanded and now offers other services to its clientele, which is 90 percent Asian.

"We try to promote the Asian outlook," Lee sald. "And we are always trying to make our parties a little different from the others." The innovative ideas that come out of the Party Crowd Production staff have resulted in boat dances, dances that included fashion shows promoting Asian models, and dances in places that have never held such functions before, such as Maxwell Plum's.

"A lot of people have asked me 'why don't you hold a party at this place or that?' because these places would attract a lot of business, but these places have to meet my criteria. There are some places where I wouldn't throw parties because it would kill my clientele."

Party Crowd Production, which handles about 10 Asian bandnin the Bay Area, was also lirst to introduce Mr. Greenjeans—the new dance club at the Embargadero Center in The City.

"We also pulled off the Tri-City Convention, when everybody else thought it wasn't possible."

For two years the Tri-City Convention has brought together the party crowd in San Francisco, Los Angeles and Honolulu. Held at the Pacific Beach Hotel, the big bash has annually attracted approximately 700 people, including 200 from California. Party Crowd Production organizes the travel package for the visitors from the Mainland as part of its services.

Lee intends to add Seattle to the list of cities that will participate in functions with the party-goers in California and Hawaii.

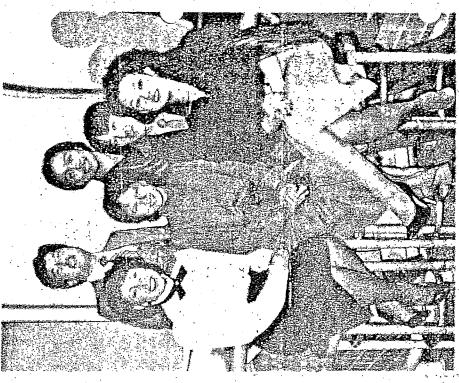
Catering primarily to people in their early 20s, the entertainment agency also provides travel services so clients can book tours to Europe, China and Japan, alond with various cruises.

Other services that Parry Crowd Production offers Include entertainment consulting, food catering, graphic art design, ilmousine services, mailing service and an answering service.

"A lot of money has been put Into researching ways of better serving our clients, and it's starting to pay off," Lee said.

He also noted that in trying to satisfy the young Asian American crowd, there's a difference in the style of music that is played at the parties. "Just like the gay crowd is more open to new music, disco or whatever, it takes the Asian crowd a little longer to like the new music, they prefer music that they hear often on the radio."

With a current mailing list of 3,000 in. 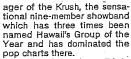

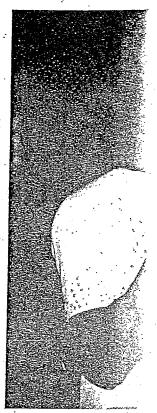

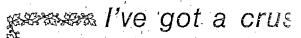

Krush Kharisma hit the mainland last week when Hawaii's hottest young contemporary showgroup brought their array of talent to the Sahara Tahoe Hotel and San Francisco's Bimbo's 365 Club

and Choice's Cabaret. Audiences in Hawaii have been singing praises for the past decade about these tal-ented musicians and polished vocalists who have become Hawaii's most exciting attrac-tion produced by the island entertainment industry. Yet many a patron entering the High Sierra Theatre seemed a little unsure about who they were seeing and what kind of show they were getting themselves in for.

That uncertainty ended rapidly when bursting on stage came nine appealing young men filled with youth-ful exhuberance and energy, superb instrumental and vocal talent, charisma and lov-able personalities. From the moment lead singer Bobby Gonzales beckoned the audience to join them in a big Aloha Hello, the Krush had them in the palms of their talented hands!

For the 1940s folks, of which I must admit being a member, the Krush does do a string of Glenn Miller tunes —"Tuxedo Junction," "In the Mood"—all faithfully revived right down to the band being dressed in Army uniforms during the mellow clarinet solo on "Moonlight Serenade." Their "Don't Sit Under the Apple Tree" number with Bobby Gonzales on vocal, is a crowd-pleaser with Wade Kuroiwa jitterbugging in, bewigged and skirted like a bobby soxer. As the audience clapped and reminisced, the rest of the Krushers did a march/dance to the strong

beat of "American Patrol."

But it paid off and Anna Lea and the Fabulous Krush became one of the biggest draws at the Hilton Hawaiian Village Garden Bar.

Chung instilled in them the belief that the Krush would be a success if they would be willing to put energy and determination into their music. "You'll be shining examples for all Asian Americans who are willing to work hard to make great things happen," they were told.

Chung now manages the Krush full-time. They began to gain exposure in the local music scene, playing in dance contests, promotions and benefit performances and spending money on costumes, equipment, choreography and music lessons. They worked hard to learn to entertain their audi-

ence as a showband instead of just playing music. In 1980 the Krush released its first album under their own label, Dove. It was titled "Fabu-lous Krush." This debut LP went on to hit number one on the local charts and won three Hoku Awards (the Hawaiian

Grammy), including "Album of the-Year" and "Contemporary Album of the Year." It included several of their seven Top-10 singles in the state's market. Attendance at their shows

grew tremendously, and the group closed at the Hilton to open an engagement at the Ocean Showroom in Walkiki's Reef Hotel. They also went on to do a TV special and a conto do a 1v special and a con-cert at Honolulu's largest indoor facility, the NBC Arena. They released a second album, "The Krush" and their latest "Krush" III" promises to be another win-

"I feel that we have a lot more to learn," Ramones said. "We have been fulfilling our goals and we are moving really fast, being a major band in Hawaii. Now we are aiming at national exposure, and we have to keep

trying."
"It is a hard business. There's a lot of competition out there, so we're constantly rehearsing.

I'd rather perform than rehearse, but of course you can't do one without the other," he laughed. love for. Hawaii and faith in God. "In our show we try to incor-porate that we are believers. And we believe that it is because of our faith we are where we're at today," Ramones said.

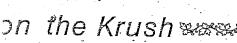

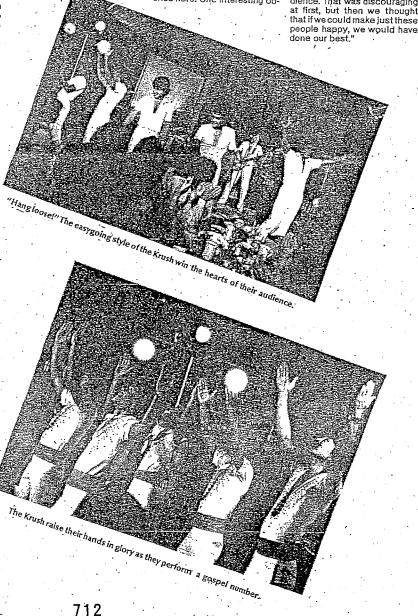

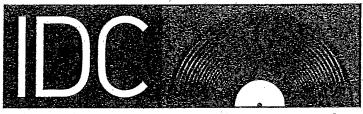

With major changes in the modern music industry, independent artists and labels seek new ways to get their music out. Steffen noticed these issues as he himself has faced distribution challenges, too. He launched Independent Distribution Collective in 2004 and since then has grown the company from 9 labels to over 350 labels with close to 500 releases in less than 7 years. In addition to launching a physical distribution company, which now includes both digital, film and DVD distribution, SOS has also developed services like "InstantDistro" a turnkey marketing and promotion service, and "A La Carte Management" which helps advance the independent music community and educate developing artists.

A dancehall reggae innovator, a DJ / producer / remixer and the owner of PSM Recordings, he has been bringing his conscious reggae vibes to throngs of people from New York to the Hawaiian Islands (and San Francisco in between) for almost 2 decades. A New York City native, SOS moved to Maui in 1991 where he broke the freshest dancehall tracks to scores of locals as well as tourists from around the globe at Studio 505, a Stephen Stills' nightclub. At that time he also managed and produced Marty Dread & Culture Shock, the most popular reggae band in the islands.

1993 brought him to San Francisco to play venues like Miss Pearl's Jam House, Kennel Club and others. Together with former partner Stefan G. Board Qualifications:

The Entertainment Commission shall consist of 7 members comprised of 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors and 4 members nominated by the Mayor.

Each nomination by the Mayor shall be subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors and shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a mayoral nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed approved.

Of the 4 members nominated by the Mayor, the Mayor shall nominate one member to represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of the urban planning community, and one member to represent the interests of the law enforcement community.

Of the 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, one member shall represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member shall represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups and one member shall represent the interests of the public health community.

To stagger the terms the initial appointments to the commission shall be as follows: the Mayor nominates two members to serve terms of four years, one member to serve a term of three years

and one member to serve a term of two years. Of the three remaining members, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member to serve a term of four years, one member to serve a term of three years and one member to serve a term of two years. All terms of initial appointees to the commission shall be deemed to commence upon the same date which shall be the date upon which the last of the seven initial appointees assumes office. Thereafter, all appointments and reappointments shall be for a term of four years.

The Entertainment Commission shall: 1) assist entertainment organizers and operators to apply for necessary permits; 2) promote responsible conduct; 3) promote the City's entertainment industry; 4) promote the use of City facilities; 5) foster harm reduction policies; 6) develop "good neighbor policies"; 7) mediate disputes between persons affected by entertainment events and establishments and the operators of such establishments; 8) issue entertainment related permits; 9) plan and coordinate City services for major events; 10) provide information regarding venues and services appropriate for events and functions ancillary to conventions.

Reports: Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors within one year from July 6, 2002 and not less than five years thereafter a report analyzing the commission's effectiveness. Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors an annual report by March 1st regarding its activities for the preceding year. Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors within one year from July 6, 2002 and annually thereafter a report analyzing fee revenue.
