19	Elections shall no later than noon of the seventy-sixth day prior to the election select the argument to be published according to the order of priority shown herein.

22	(A)	The proponent of an initiative petition; or the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors or	
23	four membe	ers of the Board of Supervisors if the measure is submitted by the same;

1	(D) Any state or local elected official who is registered to vote in San Francisco, excluding

5	(2) Arguments opposing a measure:		
6	(A) In the case of a referendum, the person who files a referendum petition with the

10	(D) Any state or local elected official who is registered to vote in San Francisco, excluding		
11	members of a state or county central committee of a political party;

14	(b) In the event that more than one argument is submitted for or against a measure		
15	at any given level of priority and no argument entitled to higher priority is submitted, the		
16	Director of Elections shall select the "proponent's" or "opponent's" argument by lot from		
17	among all arguments at the highest level of priority. Each individual, group, organization or		
18	association shall be permitted to submit only one argument per measure for selection pursuant to this		
19	section. No person shall be permitted to author more than one argument per measure submitted for		
20	selection pursuant to this section.
