Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$1,286,200 from the U.S. Department of Energy to develop plans in multiple neighborhoods to develop Solar Energy with Energy Storage for Post-Disaster Preparedness for the term of December 15, 2014, through December 31, 2016.

WHEREAS, The City highly values disaster preparedness activities; and WHEREAS, Solar power, in conjunction with energy storage can provide long term

secure power for critical electric loads without the need for liquid fuels; and

[Accept and Expend Grant -Solar Energy with Energy Storage- \$1,286,200]

WHEREAS, Multiple critical loads can be linked together to create a 'micro-grid' that improves stability and allows the loads to balance the use of available power; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Environment worked with Department of Emergency Management (DEM) to incorporate solar with energy storage and micro-grids into the City's Hazard Mitigation Plan and into the City's proposed Energy Assurance Plan; and

WHEREAS, With a previously approved grant from the California Energy Commission, the Department of the Environment has already completed a report on integrating renewable resources into neighborhood electric distribution systems; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Energy has granted the City, through the Department of Environment, \$1,286,200 to develop a plan for at least twelve solar powered micro-grids in the City along with other tools that will assist other local government across the United States; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Energy has also granted \$35,000 of assistance from two National Laboratories to assist in the project; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Environment has partnered with DEM, the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, and Pacific Gas & Electric in this project; and

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment will engage neighborhoods in this project; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO) amendment and partially reimburses the Department of the Environment for one existing position; and

WHEREAS, The term of this grant is from December 15, 2014 to December 31, 2016; and

WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because the Department of the Environment needed time to process this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, The budget includes indirect costs of \$34,256; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department of the Environment to retroactively accept and expend a grant in the amount of up to \$1,286,200 for the development of plans for solar, energy storage, and micro-grids to improve disaster preparedness in the City and County of San Francisco.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### **Legislative Objectives**

The proposed resolution would retroactively authorize the San Francisco Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant for \$1,286,200 from the US Department of Energy to create plans to develop solar energy with energy storage for post-disaster preparedness. The term of the grant is December 15, 2014 through December 31, 2016.

# **Key Points**

- In 2014, the City of San Francisco developed the Hazard Mitigation Plan (Plan) to assess risks to San Francisco by natural and human-caused hazards, and to develop mitigation strategies for reducing the impact of those risks. The Plan calls for the implementation and use of solar energy storage to power electrical backup systems for these assets.
- In 2014, the US Department of Energy awarded a grant of \$1,286,200 to the San Francisco Department of the Environment to plan and design the Solar + Storage Resiliency Project in San Francisco.

# **Fiscal Impact**

- The total budget for the Solar + Storage Project is \$1,575,171, consisting of the subject grant funds of \$1,286,200 from the US Department of Energy, and \$288,971 in matching funds provided by the City of San Francisco.
- Matching funds of \$288,971 is comprised of in-kind contributions from City departments and outside contractors performing work on the Project.

#### Recommendation

Approve the proposed resolution.

### **MANDATE STATEMENT**

City Administrative Code Section 10.170-1 states that accepting Federal, State, or third-party grant funds in the amount of \$100,000 or more, including any City matching funds required by the grant, is subject to Board of Supervisors approval.

# **BACKGROUND**

In 2014, the City of San Francisco developed the Hazard Mitigation Plan<sup>1</sup> (Plan) to assess risks to San Francisco by natural and human-caused hazards, and to develop mitigation strategies for reducing the impact of those risks. The Plan identified 20 such hazards, which included disruption of energy supplies in the event of emergency. In order to ensure continuance of energy supplies to critical City assets, the Plan calls for the implementation and use of solar energy storage to power electrical backup systems for these assets.

The US Department of Energy Solar Market Pathways Program supports projects that are advancing solar deployment across the United States. These projects develop strategic plans to expand solar electricity use for residential, community, and commercial properties. In 2014, the US Department of Energy awarded a grant of \$1,286,200 to the San Francisco Department of the Environment to plan and design the Solar + Storage Resiliency Project in San Francisco.

#### **DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION**

The proposed resolution would retroactively authorize the San Francisco Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant for \$1,286,200 from the US Department of Energy to create plans to develop solar energy with energy storage for post-disaster preparedness. The term of the grant is December 15, 2014 through December 31, 2016.

### US Department of Energy Solar Market Pathways Grant

The Department of the Environment will use the \$1,286,200 grant to implement the Solar + Storage for Resiliency Project (Project). The Project will plan and design a solar storage system to maintain energy supply in San Francisco in the event of a natural disaster. Current liquid fuel generators that supply emergency power have a limited quantity of energy, which may not be sufficient in case of a prolonged outage. The Project would design a system in which solar energy is captured at multiple sites in a neighborhood and link them together in a micro-grid

that could increase the total capacity needed to operate those facilities. Twelve neighborhoods will be included in the Project<sup>2</sup>. The Project tasks are listed below.

- Researching existing projects that use similar micro-grid technology.
- Identifying disaster preparedness zones in San Francisco to detail which buildings have power needs and can be grouped together to form a micro-grid.
- Analyzing technical feasibility of solar + storage systems in San Francisco
- Studying technical and economic barriers to development of solar + storage solutions.
- Facilitating stakeholder engagement with groups such as public officials, utilities, first responders, relevant City departments, and business and community groups.
- Disseminating research and findings to regional, State and national networks.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

A shown in Table 1 below, the total budget for the Solar + Storage Project is \$1,575,171, consisting of the subject grant funds of \$1,286,200 from the US Department of Energy, and \$288,971 in matching funds provided by the City of San Francisco.

Technical analysis and financial modeling work for the Project will be performed by outside firms specializing in engineering and finance of clean energy projects. Community Outreach work for the Project is required to meet with constituencies to identify power needs for disaster planning in the neighborhoods where the Project will be based. Each neighborhood is being allocated approximately \$3,000 for these services. Mr. Cal Broomhead, Climate and Energy Programs Manager of the Department of the Environment, states that these services will likely be provided by non-profit community-based organizations. Mr. Broomhead provided a budget totaling \$974,700 for the outside firms' and City staff costs, as shown in Table 2 below.

Mr. Broomhead states that the Department of the Environment has an existing contract with Arup to provide environmental services in an amount not-to-exceed \$3,000,000, which was awarded through a competitive process. Arup will perform the needed technical analysis for the Project under this existing contract.

According to Mr. Broomhead, the Department of the Environment has spent \$19,100 in grant funds prior to receiving Board of Supervisors authorization in order to remain on schedule for grant deliverables. This spending was related to: 1) travel to attend required Project meetings; and 2) consultant work.

Planning and designing at least eleven projects for independent electricity operation of critical loads in neighborhoods in San Francisco. A combination of City facilities and community serving facilities will be identified for their critical electric loads that must operate during an extended power outage such as those caused by a major disaster. Critical loads are those such as telecommunications, battery charging for cell phones and wheel chairs, medical equipment, and essential lighting. A community process will assist in the identification of facilities and their loads. The design phase will identify the quantity and location of solar photovoltaic panels and energy storage that will enable continuous operation of identified critical loads. A financial analysis will determine the funding requirements and sources to build, operate and maintain the systems. The project will provide a "roadmap" for future systems in San Francisco and in other U.S. cities.

The contractor, ARUP, had already been selected through a competitive process in 2010 (BPEV10000014-402-09/10) and the contract termination is beyond the end of the term of the grant. ARUP was selected by the Department for a previous study funded by the California Energy Commission of the integration of renewable energy into the electric grid, focusing on the South of Market area. This work will extend the lessons learned to at least ten other neighborhoods throughout the city and provide a detailed design of the solar plus energy storage solutions for the critical loads in each neighborhood.

- c. If so, will contract services help to further the goals of the Department's Local Business Enterprise (LBE) requirements? Not substantially. There is \$5,000 for local organizations to perform community level marketing to bring residents to planning meetings. Other contractual work is highly specialized with cutting edge technologies.

ARUP will provide services that cannot be provided by City forces; however, SFPUC is a partner and it is expected that knowledge transfer will enable some of the future technical work to be performed by City forces. Otherwise, the Department will continue to use ARUP until the current contract terminates.

# **Objectives**

The primary goals of the project are to accelerate the deployment of PV nationwide and create a roadmap for using PV as a viable tool for energy security in the event of an emergency.

# **Project Objectives:**

- Initiate the project by conducting thorough research of synergistic projects, previous research, and
  candidate products and technology, resulting in a comprehensive research compendium. The research
  will look U.S. wide and will draw on work done to date, such as the Florida Solar Shelters. We will issue
  a report on the state of the current San Francisco disaster preparedness plans with respect to electricity
  needs of buildings.
- Facilitate stakeholder engagement through the formation and management of a working group to assist in preparing a solar+storage solution, integrated into a disaster preparedness plan. The stakeholder group will include utilities, first responders, emergency service providers, relevant City Departments, and other community and business stakeholders. We will produce presentations for each meeting along with detailed minutes and conclusions. The goal of the working group is to review and assess task work, specifically on disaster prep plan research, road map development, load sizing tool development and outreach/dissemination plans. Key stakeholders, including storage companies and utilities will also provide technical and regulatory review of proposed plans.
- Identify Disaster Preparedness Zones in San Francisco. These will be outlined in a series of GIS maps
  detailing where in San Francisco buildings are located that have power needs as part of their disaster
  preparedness plans and identify where buildings can be grouped to form a microgrid and share power
  in the event of an extended outage.
- Address technical and economic barriers to solar+storage and outline solutions. Team will produce a
  road map depicting how micro-grids, electrical storage, and islandable distributed solar systems can be
  implemented throughout the US and develop a peer reviewed report on financing mechanisms
  leveraging established models and programs. The road map will by posted to the CCSF website and
  shared at conferences.
- Explore technical feasibility of solar+storage systems in San Francisco. The team will present the technical feasibility to storage vendors such as STEM and the local San Francisco utilities to validate the technical feasibility. Team will identify and/or develop a tool for a non-technical audience in order to assess what electrical loads are required to be maintained in the event of an extended outage and gather stakeholders to understand what retrofit equipment may be required to allow existing buildings with solar+storage to operate in an extended outage. Tool will be available online.
- Team will package and disseminate the plan to regional, state and national networks using various outreach methods including a Best Practices Manual. The team will present at conferences and host workshops.
