[Mid-Embarcadero Arts Enrichment]
RECOMMENDING THAT SAN FRANCISCO'S POLICY OF ARTS ENRICHMENT FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS BE INTERPRETED BROADLY TO INCLUDE BOTH VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS PROJECTS, AND URGING THE ARTS COMMISSION AND THE SAN FRANCISCO TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY TO SUPPORT THE ORGAN PAVILION PROJECT AS ART ENRICHMENT FOR THE MID-EMBARCADERO ROADWAY PROJECT.

WHEREAS, It is the policy of the City and County of San Francisco to appropriate funds to be administered by the Arts Commission for "art enrichment of proposed public buildings, above ground structures, parks, and transportation improvement projects," with appropriate "art enrichment" for a project to be determined by the Arts Commission (Administrative Code Section 3.19); and,

WHEREAS, The Mid-Embarcadero Roadway Project currently under construction in front of the Ferry Building includes in its budget funds from the San Francisco Transportation Authority for arts enrichment; and,

WHEREAS, The Arts Commission proposed for arts enrichment in the Mid-Embarcadero a sculpture known as "Embark," which was rejected by the San Francisco Transportation Authority; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco, through the Department of Recreation and Parks, is constructing a Music Concourse at Steuart and Market Streets on the west side of the Mid-Embarcadero Roadway and proposes

1 to place a privately financed Organ Pavilion in the Concourse to
2 house the City's "Exposition" Organ; and,

3 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors endorsed the concept of the
4 Music Concourse and Organ Pavilion in Resolution #566-98, and;

5 WHEREAS, The Committee for the Waterfront Organ Pavilion and the
6 San Francisco Chapter of the American Guild of Organists have
7 petitioned the Arts Commission to use the arts enrichment funds to
8 install the "Exposition" Organ in the proposed Organ Pavilion; and,

9 WHEREAS, The Port Commission, which owns most of the real
10 property covered by the Mid-Embarcadero Roadway Project, on August
11 18, 1999 adopted a resolution endorsing the Music Concourse and Organ
12 Pavilion and urging "interested parties" to support the fundraising
13 for the Organ Pavilion; now, therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors recommends that San
15 Francisco's policy of arts enrichment for public improvement projects
16 be interpreted broadly to include both visual and performing arts
17 projects, and urges the Arts Commission and the San Francisco
18 Transportation Authority to support the Organ Pavilion project as art
19 enrichment for the Mid-Embarcadero Roadway Project.




