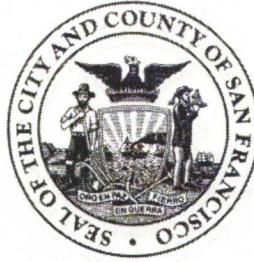

I have lived in San Francisco's Mission District since 2008, and in the last 15 years, I have seen the rapid change in our neighborhood, driven in large part by insufficient housing to allow people from a range of backgrounds to stay here. This is part of the reason that I undertook a career change to affordable housing. I worked at BRIDGE for three years as a project manager, during which time I managed the rehabilitation of over 500 units of public housing in the Mission and in Bernal Heights, with no displacement, in close partnership with Mission Economic Development Agency and Bernal Heights Neighborhood Center. Currently, I work with affordable housing providers around the Bay Area to help source financing and execute projects involving both new construction and preservation. My experience has allowed me not only the opportunity to understand the diverse perspectives of residents of public and other subsidized housing, but also what is required to purchase, build, and operate it, and what it takes to meet residents' needs. In addition to my work in the field, I am black, and an immigrant from Trinidad and Tobago, having moved to the United States to attend university. I naturalized in 2012, after 14 years, and have a special sensitivity to the challenges faced by non-citizens, and particularly undocumented people, in gaining housing security. As a parent of two young native San Franciscans, I care deeply that we have a city that can accommodate everyone who wants to live here well into the future, and affordable housing is a missing piece of that equation today.

Business and/or Professional Experience:

2014-2017: I was a Project Manager at BRIDGE Housing, where I led the rehabilitation of over 500 units of public housing in San Francisco. These projects included senior/disabled housing in the Mission, and family housing in Bernal Heights. These buildings were renovated after years of deferred maintenance, recapitalized with a range of private and public financing sources, and set up with empowered tenant associations. At BRIDGE, I also secured state and local financing for affordable housing projects in San Leandro and Oakland.

2017-2019: I managed Special Projects at FivePoint Communities, which included overseeing design of pilot programs for transportation to Candlestick Point and the Hunters Point Shipyard, as well as research into sustainability modeling for the company's redevelopment.

2019-2022: I worked as a self-employed consultant and then as a Senior Project Manager with Mosaic Urban Development, based in the Bay Area. My project work entailed financial and project management work in affordable housing around the region. This included development, financial modeling, funding applications, policy, and site acquisition.

2023: Beginning in late January, I will be the Director of Real Estate Development at Berkeley Food and Housing, a service provider and affordable housing developer that operates across Northern California.
