15 WHEREAS, The Electorate of the City and County of San Francisco passed

19 WHEREAS, The City has previously approved outside contracts for the services
20 listed below; and,

21 WHEREAS, The Controller has determined that a Purchaser's award of a contract for
22 the services listed below to a private contractor will continue to achieve cost savings for the
23 City; and,

24 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has a Charter obligation to enact a
25 balanced budget each fiscal year; and,

WHEREAS, The Controller's certification, which confirms that said services can be performed at lower costs to the City and County by private contractor than by employees of the City and County, is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 260612, which is hereby declared to be part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; now, therefore be it;

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby concurs with the Controller's certification and approves the Proposition J Resolution concerning the Purchaser's award of a contract to a private contractor for the services listed below for the period of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027.

Resolution concurring with the Controller's certification that department services previously approved can be performed by private contractor for a lower cost than similar work performed by City and County employees, for the following services: Budget and Legislative Analyst Services (Board of Supervisors); Fleet Security Services, Real Estate Division Custodial Services, Real Estate Division Security Services, Convention Facilities Management (General Services Agency – Administrative Services); Security Services (Department of Public Works); Security Services (Homelessness and Supportive Housing); Security Services (Human Services Agency); Food Services at County Jails (Sheriff's Department); Assembly of Vote by Mail Services (Department of Elections); and Security Services (Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development).
