Resolution urging Governor Newsom and the California State Legislature to discontinue permitting for any new oil and gas extraction, fossil fuel infrastructure, or petrochemical projects in California; and urging Governor Newsom to set California on a path to phase out existing oil production in line with the Paris climate goals, with a just and equitable transition that protects workers, communities, and economies, and require a 2,500-foot health and safety buffer between fossil-fuel infrastructure and homes, schools, and other sensitive sites.

Language and inclusivity changes:

- On page 3, line 5: replace “mothers” with “individuals”
- On page 3, line 21: replace “for people of color” with “for Black, Indigenous, and other people of color”
- On page 5, line 8: after “economies” insert “, especially frontline Black, Indigenous, and other communities of color”

Refer to youth activism on California’s oil and gas extraction policies:

- On page 4, after line 25: insert “WHEREAS, Youth activists at Youth Vs Apocalypse and Sunrise Bay Area in particular have been involved over the last year in protesting Governor Newsom’s policy reversals on approving new fossil fuel permits, continued CalSTRS investment in the fossil fuel industry, and the general lack of transparency and accountability around serious climate action at the state level in California; and”

- On page 5, line 8: after "economies" insert ", especially frontline Black, Indigenous, and other communities of color"
