AMENDED on Page 34, Lines 9-15, by adding 'are required. However, if Class 1 spaces that can be rented on an hourly basis are provided, they may count toward the garage's requirement for Class 2 spaces.' after 'None'; and Page 52, Line 3, by changing 'circumstance' to 'circumstances', Line 4, by adding '(i)' before 'For', Line 8, by changing 'an' to 'this', Lines 14-22, by adding '(ii) For required bicycle parking in non-accessory automobile garages or lots with 500 or more spaces. In order to obtain this exemption, the Responsible City Official shall provide to the Zoning Administrator in writing an analysis demonstrating that the demand for bicycle parking in that location is less than the amount required by Section 155.3 of this Code. This exemption may only be provided for any required bicycle parking above fifty Class 2 spaces. The exemption for these garages may be issued for up to one year. The Responsible City Official shall provide the required bicycle parking within one year of the issuance of such exemption, or shall obtain a new exemption for each year until such bicycle parking is provided.', Line 23, by adding 'Temporary exemptions,', and Lines 24-25, by adding 'Temporary exemptions for Class 2 bicycle parking shall be granted as allowed in subsection 1(B) above.' after 'Parking.' by the following vote:
