CEO and Executive Director Meals On Wheels of San Francisco

Ashley C. McCumber was appointed Executive Director of Meals on Wheels San Francisco (www.mowsf.org) effective August 1, 2007. As Executive Director, Mr. McCumber oversees the daily operations of the organization, spearheads fundraising and development initiatives of a \$7.2 million operation serving more than 2800 San Francisco homebound seniors each year, and acts as the liaison to government and community agencies. MOWSF is the largest provider of nutrition and supportive services to homebound seniors in San Francisco and among the largest programs of its type in the country.

In addition to his position at MOWSF, Mr. McCumber is currently Vice President of the Board for CalNonprofits – ([http://calnonprofits.org/.](http://calnonprofits.org/)) Prior to joining MOWSF, Mr. McCumber was the President/Chief Executive Officer of United South End Settlements (USES - <http://www.uses.org/>) in Boston, Massachusetts, joining that Agency in 2002. Mr. McCumber was successful at increasing programming for families and children, and boosting the agency's offerings which improved cohesion and civic participation in the South End and Lower Roxbury neighborhoods. As President of USES, Mr. McCumber oversaw a \$3.7 million annual operating budget, supporting four facilities. He was responsible for the delivery of a wide-range of community-based human service programs delivered in a traditional settlement house fashion. These programs were overlapping and intricately linked to reach people of all ages and backgrounds.

While at USES, Mr. McCumber was on the Board of Directors of Stonewall Communities (<http://sites.stonewallcommunities.org/www/about-us>), an organization dedicated to addressing issues of LGBT Aging. In addition, as President of USES, he provided a home and support for the Boston Prime Timers (<http://www.bostonprimetimers.org/about.htm>), which serves as a brotherhood of mature gay and bisexual men and their friends who join together for educational, support, and social activities.

Along with 20 years of non-profit and community leadership experience, Mr. McCumber has extensive expertise in fundraising, community relations, non-profit management, and arts and event administration. In 1999, he led the marketing and development effort to open the largest Latino cultural center in the country located in San Jose, CA, The Mexican Heritage Plaza ([http://www.mhcviva.org/.](http://www.mhcviva.org/))

Some of the executive and managerial positions formerly held by Mr. McCumber include his service as Executive Director, Springstep Center for Traditional Dance and Music, Medford, MA; Senior Director of Institutional Advancement, Unitarian Universalists Service Committee, Cambridge, MA; Director of Development, Marketing and Communications, Codman Square Health Center, Dorchester, MA; Associate Director of Development and Alumni Relations at Bridgewater State College; and Director of Tourism and Cultural Development for the City of New Bedford, MA.

Mr. McCumber resides in the Castro District of San Francisco with his husband of 15 years, Craig Davini.



To the Selection Committee for San Francisco's LGBT Seniors Task Force,

I am writing to apply for a seat on San Francisco's lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) Seniors Task Force, which I learned about at the *Community Meeting about Issues facing LGBT Seniors of Color on July 26, 2012*. As a long-time resident and active member in the community, I have the personal experience of aging in San Francisco, and a demonstrated commitment to serving San Francisco's LGBT older adult community. As a social worker, I will bring my expertise and knowledge, including my professional experiences and understanding of the complexity of issues facing our LGBT older adult community to San Francisco's LGBT Senior Task Force.

Arriving in San Francisco in 1985, I saw the first onslaught and devastating effects of AIDS, and witnessed the pain and suffering of friends, families, and the community. During this period I found solace as an emotional support volunteer with Shanti Project. This is also where I met a fellow volunteer and my future partner. As the battle raged on and with little support from our federal government, we soon found ourselves participating in numerous protests targeting our government's failure to respond to the growing epidemic. For several years our cries fell on deaf ears, but were soon heard as research and the approval process for new medications shifted gears and the healing process slowly begun. In the years that followed my commitment to the health and wellbeing of the community continued through various volunteer positions with the AIDS Foundation and Pets Are Wonderful Support, and later through employment opportunities with New Leaf Services and the LGBT Community Center. All of this was about to take a sudden and drastic change as my long-time partner's health began to decline with the later stages of HIV.

My partner's battle with AIDS lasted five long years – wrought with both debilitating physical conditions and the accompanying emotional pain manifesting itself in the form of depression, anxiety and isolation. This was one of the most difficult and challenging periods of my life, but one that would ultimately guide me on a new path and journey. A year after his passing, I began a deep and personal search within and decided to return back to school and advance my commitment to the health and wellbeing of San Francisco's LGBTQ community, and specifically its LGBT older adult community.

My first year internship with Openhouse was a rich and rewarding experience, in which I began to understand that my partner was not alone in his fight against AIDS. Many long-term survivors now in 50s and 60s are still coping with the traumatic effects of HIV. This includes the long-term


side effects of medications, physical conditions typically associated with advanced aging, and mental health conditions related to loss and trauma. Furthermore, I feel that the degree of loss and trauma that LGBT older adults experienced, especially long-term survivors of HIV, is a mental health issue that has not received adequate attention. Working directly with LGBT older adults also provided me insight into the complexity of issues they face such as limited access to housing, proper healthcare, and discrimination. It is important to note that many LGBT older adults are forced back into the closet due to systemic discrimination in long-term care facilities. In order to inform social service providers of the unique challenges facing LGBT older adults Openhouse created its' LGBT Older Adult Cultural Humility Curriculum, which I was given the opportunity to co-facilitate numerous social services provider trainings. These trainings were in conjunction with the passage of AB 2920 the Older Californians Equality and Protection Act. Furthermore, the curriculum also includes *Best Practices*, which calls for the inclusion of sexual orientation and the expansion of gender identity category on intake forms. If appointed, I would highly recommend that San Francisco's Department of Aging and Adult Services mandate a policy to collect this vital information from all social service providers. I also participated in the LGBT and Asian & Pacific Islander Partnerships, and in 2011, I was an invited attendee to the First National People of Color LGBT Aging Convening in Washington, D.C. My internship at Openhouse was critical in my understanding the array of issues confronting LGBT older adults. Understanding innovative ways to address individuals living with mental health conditions led me to my second year internship.

The Student Success Program (SSP) at San Francisco State University provides individual support to students in the College of Health and Social Sciences. The program adheres to the mental health recovery model which recognizes the critical role peer support plays in the recovery process. The SSP was instrumental in my decision to create a peer-based mental health support program for LGBT older adults as part of my culminating project, which also included a grant proposal for future funding. During this time I was also invited to serve on San Francisco's Community Behavioral Health Services Older Adult Peer Services Planning Board, which is responsible for developing recommendations for expanded programs for older adult behavioral health services in San Francisco.

As a long-time resident and active member in the community, I am committed to the health and wellbeing of San Francisco's LGBTQ community, and specifically its LGBT older adult community. Moreover, I have the professional experience, knowledge and understanding of the complexity of issues facing LGBT older adults. As a social worker, I will bring my skills as a researcher, community organizer, and negotiator to the LGBT Senior Task Force.

To the Selection Committee for the LGBT Seniors Task Force,

It is with great pleasure that I write this letter of recommendation for Mr. Scott Hiatsuka. I was Scott's internship supervisor at San Francisco State University's Student Success Program (SSP) from August, 2011, to May, 2012. The SSP is an innovative program funded by the Mental Health Services Act that supports students who are preparing for careers in the human services and who have experienced behavioral health issues or who come from communities that are underserved and underrepresented in the public health system. Our goals are to increase access and enrollment, enhance retention, and maximize graduation rates. The SSP employs a wrap-around and multidisciplinary approach, assisting students in building a healthy and stable lifestyle while in school. Consideration is given to the needs and preferences of S.F. State's ethnically and culturally diverse populations including its large and active LGBTQI community. The SSP also mounts public information campaigns to raise awareness and educate the campus and community about behavioral health and recovery.

I believe that Scott is highly qualified to serve on the LGBT Seniors Task Force as he has a long and proven history in providing services to both older adults and people living with mental health issues. He made use of his previous experiences as an intern at Openhouse, providing housing and support services to LGBT seniors, and at the Canon Kip Senior Center, as well as his employment at New Leaf Services, the Progress Foundation, and the LGBT Community Center to inform and enrich his work at the SSP. During his time at the SSP, Scott was involved in the community stakeholder process that has been furnishing evaluation and guidance to S.F. City and County's MHSA projects. Based on his participation in these advisory endeavors, he was invited to serve on a S.F.'s CBHS Older Adult Peer Services Planning Board developing recommendations for expanded programs for older adults in San Francisco.

Scott has a particular interest in enhancing peer support for aging adults and is firmly grounded in wellness and recovery policies and practices. While serving at the Student Success Program, Scott developed a well considered proposal to utilize the peer provided support that is central to services at the SSP with LGBT older adults in the Bay Area. During his time at the SSP, Scott assisted in co-facilitating our weekly peer mentorship training and in providing supervision to the participants. In addition, he played a central role in initiating a monthly support group for older and returning students.

Scott is a truly gifted individual - highly intelligent, conscientious, creative, and self-motivated. He has shown a great capacity to help people find common ground and reach consensus when they hold opposing viewpoints. Throughout his time at the Student Success Program, Scott provided the bedrock on which our services are built. He exhibited a remarkable understanding of both the mission and daily operations of our program as well as the nature of the communities that we serve and he consistently found ways of contributing to the advancement of our organizational goals. The majority of students that we serve at the SSP report a multiplicity of stressors and challenges including poverty, oppression, social injustice, stressors related to immigration, community and


domestic violence, war, incarceration, substance misuse, physical and sexual abuse and other forms of trauma, variations in ability, serious or chronic health issues, and learning differences. Three-quarters of the students we serve are people of color. Scott was consistently sensitive to cultural factors with a potential impact on the assessment and intervention process.

Scott offered individual counseling and care management and engaged in intake, biopsychosocial assessment, the development of an educational and wellness service plan, resource coordination, and aid in transitioning to employment or graduate school. His interpersonal skills are exceptional, which was indispensable to the program as one of our goals is to attract students who might otherwise be reluctant to seek out services. He has the ability to put people at their ease and to support them in feeling welcomed and comfortable. He possesses profoundly penetrative observational capacities as well as excellent listening and communication skills. Scott invariably engendered a high level of trust in the students he served, who were subsequently able to experience new facets of themselves and reach desired goals. He exhibited a wonderful enthusiasm for his work and a heartfelt respect for the dignity and right to self-determination of his clients. Through the variety of SSP activities and interventions, Scott unfailingly communicated that he truly cares about the needs and interests of those with whom he is interacting, be they students, staff, or community partners. He is able to work independently as well as part of a team and his problem solving and critical thinking skills are exemplary.

We at the Student Success Program have been intensively engaged in outreach activities as it is critical to our mission to engage students who might otherwise be reluctant to seek support. Scott is an articulate public speaker and exhibits an authentic warmth and caring. He has cultivated productive relationships with providers and our partners across campus including Pride@SFSU, an organization of faculty, staff, and students who identify as LGBTQI. The positive connections that Scott has made have had a beneficial impact in terms of referrals to our program and engagement in collaborative efforts throughout the university.

It is always a gift to have an individual like Scott Hiatsuka involved in a community effort. I cannot think of a more worthy candidate for the LGBT Seniors Task Force than Scott. He would be a great asset and make an extraordinary contribution to the process. I give him my highest recommendation. Qualifications

I believe I am qualified to serve on the Task Force based on my 25 years of experience in law, government, public policy, nonprofit management and community activism. As a Deputy County Counsel for San Mateo County and as a legislative aide to San Francisco Supervisor Susan Leal, I have developed an excellent understanding of government and how it works. In particular, through my many civic activities over the years, I have learned how things get done in San Francisco, and how things don't get done too. I have experience not only with the inner workings of San Francisco government and politics, but I also have extensive experience working in the community with diverse populations and complex issues. In particular, I have devoted much time over the years to public policy development in the areas of healthcare, mental healthcare, HIV/AIDS, senior services, housing, the LGBT community, communities of color, civil rights.

As a nonprofit development manager for twelve years, I also developed a thorough understanding of nonprofit management and the relationship between the nonprofit community and local, state and federal government agencies and programs. Working in nonprofit development and marketing, I learned quite a bit about project budgeting and funding, and helped plan for new and expanded programs in the agencies I worked at. In 2009, I graduated from a fifteen month Fellowship in Nonprofit Management sponsored by Jewish Family and Children's Services of San Francisco and taught by a member of the Boston University Business School faculty. This course greatly added to my understanding of best practices in the nonprofit industry and of the San Francisco nonprofit community specifically.

I began the effort almost two years ago when I joined the Human Rights Commission's LGBT Advisory Committee and first suggested the addition of an LGBT seniors advisory committee to the city's governmental structure as a way of creating momentum for change. During 2011, I worked with other members of the HRC's Advisory Committee and systematically began reaching out to all the stakeholders working with LGBT seniors in San Francisco. We reached a consensus proposal and took the recommendations to Supervisors Wiener and Campos who enthusiastically agreed to move the issues forward at the Board of Supervisors. After a very successful hearing on the issues in January 2012, the Supervisors proposed the establishment of the LGBT Seniors Task Force, and I have worked with their offices to help lay the groundwork for a very successful process once the Task Force gets underway.

I would very much like to serve on the Task Force so that I can see this through to the end. I believe that I have the vision necessary to help lead the Task Force in its complicated yet crucial task of reviewing past recommendations and putting forth feasible and realistic proposals to improve services for LGBT seniors. In addition to my past work in city government, law and public policy, I now work as an estate planning and trust administration attorney and my practice

almost exclusively deals with LGBT clients. Most all of my estate planning clients are either seniors already or are in the aging category, and they are all in the process of planning for their senior years. Consequently, I am keenly aware of the issues and challenges facing LGBT people as we age and I believe this insight will be very helpful in my work on the Task Force, should I have the privilege to be appointed.

Finally, I would like to say that I will make the LGBT Seniors Task Force my top priority for the time I am on the Task Force. I will attend all meetings and will gladly volunteer additional time to actively participate in the work groups and do whatever it takes to make the Task Force successful in all respects. I will give the community every opportunity for input, and I will be patient and respectful with all who appear before or work with the Task Force. In particular, I will do everything I can to give LGBT seniors the opportunity to participate and to make their voices heard during the process.

A. Personal Statement

One purpose of the LGBT Seniors Task Force is to identify and mitigate barriers affecting LGBT seniors in accessing high-quality services in San Francisco related to their physical, emotional, social and spiritual health. Trained as a researcher and educator, and currently serving as the Director of Research and Program Development at Shanti Project in San Francisco (a non-profit organization serving people living with chronic illnesses, including breast cancer and HIV/AIDS), I am well-prepared to make a unique contribution to the LGBT Seniors Task Force.

My background in direct service includes assessing and addressing the needs of aging adults, many of whom belong to low-socio-economic status (SES) communities, who are homeless or marginally housed, and who depend upon safety-net hospitals, free clinics and community-based organizations for accessing social services and healthcare. Having provided direct care in the form of care navigation, psychosocial support, and therapeutic massage to women living with breast cancer at Shanti Project, 78% of whom are over the age of 50, I am shocked that only 2% of our clients currently identify as LGBT. Our data raises several questions: If being a woman and aging are the two leading factors that increase one's risk of developing breast cancer, irrespective of race, SES or sexual orientation, have social service agencies and healthcare providers that address women's issues adequately welcomed the LGBT community? Is enough outreach being done to educate LGBT women on practical and psychosocial support available to them when dealing with chronic illness, care-giving and end-of-life issues? As co-investigator of an on-going research collaboration between Shanti and UCSF on clinical trials education and access, my task is to help underserved women identify personal, social and systemic barriers that leave them feeling personally shut-down or systemically shut out from opportunities to participate in research concerning their own health and the health of their community. As such, I will be able to offer valuable insights concerning these barriers, as well as to help develop non-threatening, participant-centered investigative and educational tools to assess and address the needs of LGBT seniors in order to mitigate these barriers.

My current role at Shanti includes curriculum development, training and facilitation for our Shanti L.I.F.E. (Learning Immune Function Enhancement) Program®, an evidence-based, evidence-producing, and participant-centered self-management program currently designed for PLWHA. As such, I have facilitated self-management workshops and provided one-on-one health counseling to Shanti L.I.F.E. participants, 98% of whom identify as LGBT, and 50% of whom are over 50. Using my training in pastoral care and counseling, in the Shanti Model of Peer Support®, and as a Shanti L.I.F.E. Program® facilitator, I provide participants with non-directive, non-judgmental education and support, including crisis management and spiritual care. The Shanti L.I.F.E. Program® is implemented in 20 sites across the country, therefore my role also includes conducting needs assessments for diverse urban and rural populations, tailoring and adapting Shanti L.I.F.E. Program® materials to meet the needs of these populations, as well as gathering and disseminating best

practices that continue to sharpen the efficacy of our programs. According to the CDC, 50% of PLWHA will be over 50 by 2015. As an active partner in assessing and addressing needs among agencies across the country who work with PLWHA, my perspective includes an understanding of stigmatization, isolation and marginalization that occurs within communities not as welcoming as San Francisco, from which many LGBT older adults have migrated. This said, we know that in San Francisco, facilities serving older adults still do not include an assessment of socio-cultural history of clients when developing programs. In a recent conversation with Michelle Alcedo, Director of Programs at Openhouse and co-chair of the LGBT Community Partnership, we noted the paucity of programming targeting not only senior-service providers, but also seniors themselves on the makeup of the community, crossing boundaries, and creating and sustaining shared spaces of mutual respect and communal support. As an important step in raising community awareness for these issues, Shanti and the LGBT Community Partnership will be co-presenting an HIV/Aging Symposium in May 2012. I will be managing Shanti's efforts in planning and presenting the symposium.

I came to understand the need for such intentional programming as an instructor in the Graduate Liberal Studies Program at St. Mary's College in Moraga, CA, which was geared toward people pursuing second careers; a majority of whom were older adults. Over six years, I taught courses on "The Creative Process," "Crossing Boundaries," "The Sacred," and "Ethics." I also facilitated the development and completion of graduate research as a graduate thesis advisor and the instructor of "The Integrative Colloquium," in which graduate students developed their questions and methods. Each course and project involved the identification of students' cultural beliefs, practices and behaviors, and how those particularities influenced their broader experience of the larger community and their response to issues of social justice. Although most non-LGBT students were open and welcoming of their LGBT colleagues, in-depth discussions of LGBT-specific concerns and experiences were often glossed over, watered down and conflated into issues concerning "the general population" when it came to issues concerning aging. Only when students were encouraged to suspend the assumption of a common experience of aging and to understand another as truly an *other*, were they able to develop strategies for addressing the needs of the LGBT-community that were not immediately collapsed into a generic plan meant to serve seniors in general. My experiences helping students identify gaps in knowledge, motivation and tools necessary for sustained behavior change will be an invaluable asset to the LGBT Seniors Task Force, as we seek to further shape San Francisco's continuum of care into one that not only values diversity, but also acts boldly and innovatively in face of its complexity.

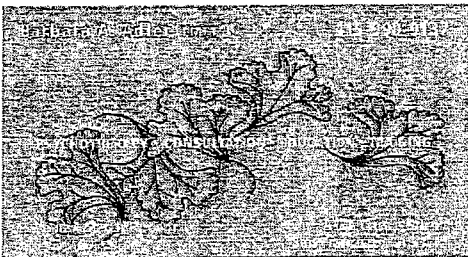

Q: I recently changed my health care provider and went to see my new doctor. On my first appointment she asked me if I had an Advance Health Care Directive. What is it; why should I have it; and how do I get it?

A: Without comment on your former doctor's practices, your new doctor is obviously more responsible and concerned about your well-being. Here's what you need to know. If you haven't time to read all, skip to the next-to-the-last paragraph for the practical information.

Prior to 2000, California had a Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care form which basically authorized a person ("agent") nominated by you to make health care decisions for you when you lost the capacity to do so. These DPAHCs were effective for a limited period of time after which they expired automatically. Any

DPAHC executed in or before 1992 is now legally ineffective.

In 2000, California passed the Health Care Decisions Law which revised its Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care law and updated rules governing health care decision-making on behalf of persons lacking capacity to make decisions about their medical/health care, including incompetent adults, and persons receiving treatment in mental health care facilities. The form has been modified several times since 2000, but in a nutshell: The new law created a model form entitled an "Advance Health Care Directive" (AHCDC) that can serve as both your health care instructions to doctors and family, and as a power of attorney nominating a person ("agent") you trust to take charge of your health care if and when you don't have the capacity to communicate with doctors.

With a properly filled out and executed Advance Health Care Directive, which must be executed while you have mental capacity (that means NOW!), you authorize this agent (and alternate agents if you so choose) to communicate with your medical providers, request and be entitled to see medical records, make decisions about your daily medical care; and represent your wishes regarding long-term and end-of-life care. Your named agent will also have the responsibility and authority to make anatomical gifts, authorize an autopsy and direct the disposition of your remains when you die. However, this

agent will not have authority to pay for or direct payment for any of these or medical costs. If you lack capacity to handle your own finances, they will have to be managed by an agent (the same or another person) under a duly executed, notarized Durable Power of Attorney for Property and Financial Management, a separate document. (CA Probate Code 4400-4465).

Here's the good news! You do not need an attorney to complete this form. Many PPOs, HMOs and hospitals have the form; if they don't offer it, ask for it. The California Medical Association (www.cmaact.org) offers a very comprehensive, understandable descriptive booklet (in large print), which includes the form for a nominal cost.

In order that the form be legally effective, you must either have it witnessed by two persons when you sign it, or sign it in the presence of a Notary Public. (If you are in a skilled nursing home, the Ombudsman must be present when you sign this document). And, finally, a COPY should go to your medical provider.

As Lori and I were cleaning her closet in order to donate things we haven't worn or have outgrown, I thought about how interesting it is that we will get rid of those inanimate objects that no longer add to our world but we will continue to hold on to those individuals who not only do not add to our mental and emotional well-being, but often are a detriment to the joy and happiness we are seeking. And why is that? Is it because we don't like change? Or is it because we simply do not have the guts to cut people loose who no longer have a place in the world we are trying to create? Remember, we're trying to create and establish the very best life we can. This is the only one we get. As far as any of us know, this is a one show only performance...so we need to go for the gold. However, it is amazing to note how many people we know who are willing to settle for the bronze. If someone does not add or help me live my best life, then they are like that jacket I no longer want to wear. It doesn't fit me anymore. They don't fit me or the direction I am heading, so why am I keeping them around? The truth is, by getting rid of people who bring darkness into my world allowed me to spend more quality time with those who brighten it, with those who fill my heart with joy and laughter. By doing so, I've been able to nurture and maintain my relationships far better than I ever had because the negativity is gone...relegated, as it were, to the D List.

Do you have people who need to land on that list? If you truly want to live your best life, you have to clean out your closet.

Attachment for Application for LGBT Seniors Task Force—Kathleen Hentges, CFP®

I became involved with LGBT senior issues first on a personal level and then on a community level. My father was a gay senior, he was financially comfortable, but socially isolated. Before his death he lived in San Diego where some services existed for low income gay seniors, but nothing for seniors who were isolated because of lack of activities or a place to gather for gay men his age. After his death I lived on the east coast for about a year and a half and volunteered with SAGE (Services and Advocacy for GLBT Elders). SAGE is the oldest and largest gay seniors organization in the country with a full range of services from welfare issues, to social events, to the first LGBT senior center in the country. I was inspired by the range, breadth and depth of the work SAGE does and how it address all of the issues faced by LGBT seniors.

As a personal financial planner I work with pre retired couples and individuals helping them make decisions now that will make them more secure during retirement. A large percentage of my clients are from the LGBT community and one of the struggles I face as a planner and they face as individuals is systemic discrimination against their relationship status and sexual orientation. I use my expertise to address these issues on an individual level, but would like to lend a hand on a community/policy level as well. I feel my education and experience with the financial and tax issues faced by the gay community will be beneficial to the task force and as an aging member of the LGBT community I would like to shape the future of what will be available for myself, my friends and my clients when the time comes.



Thank you for the opportunity to apply for the LGBT Seniors Task Force.

I have been blessed to live in an era when being gay has become increasingly accepted in society. My first concept of being "homosexual" was when my parents discussed it at the dinner table in a manner that literally equated it with a disease such as having cancer. Over time, incidents occurred that simultaneously made me more comfortable with being gay and my parents more accepting of homosexuality. For example, we happened to be watching the television program "Dynasty" one night and a gay character appeared on screen. Not a word was spoken, but my parents and I knew that something of significance was being presented to us.

Of course, society has progressed since the 1980s and being "out" is much more accepted today than ever before. However, one thing has not changed since then: most of the LGBT community puts a premium on youth and youthfulness.

This is a potentially exciting time when new norms will be created as large numbers of LGBT community member age. Or, it could be a potentially difficult time as the aging LGBT population confronts its situation.

I would like to contribute to the process of determining and implementing approaches to enhancing the quality of life for LGBT seniors. I have only one qualification for a position on the LGBT Seniors Task Force: I am an aging LGBT person who will be 57 years old in September. I do not represent any special interest group or faction within the community. I am simply an LGBT person who is approaching "senior" status.

In addition to this primary qualification, I have two secondary qualifications for the Task Force. First, I do not bring an agenda to the Task Force. I have not studied the dynamics of LGBT aging nor do I represent an established-point-of-view regarding LGBT aging. Thus, I bring an open mind to consider various courses of action. Second, my profession involves strategic planning, consensus building, change management, implementation and related skills that should contribute to the Task Force's effectiveness.

I hope you regard my lack of activism in this area as a strength rather than a weakness in my application. I want to help the community consider all options, generate a shared point-of-view and have an important and significant impact on the quality of life of LGBT seniors in San Francisco and, perhaps, around the globe.

I am currently the Programs Manager at Little Brothers Friends of the Elderly here in San Francisco. I deal with elder issues around isolation, transportation, and care management on a daily basis. I am also getting my master's in gerontology (study of aging) in the evening with a graduation date expected of December, 2012. I am extremely interested in joining the LBGT Task Force from Supervisor Scott Weiner's district 8. I would bring a unique mix of relevant field experience dealing with the current issues as a service provider in San Francisco dealing with the elderly as well as an academic education of current best practices associated with the aged.

Servicing older LBGT clients has it unique circumstances and challenges. Even in this day and age many care providers are not culturally sensitive to LBGT clients. Many gay elders are in-fear of-being discriminated against if they identifying themselves as gay. Also gay seniors are less likely to have traditional family members around to rely on to help with their care in later years. Elders that are experiencing the onset of taking multiple medications for high blood pressure or diabetes in conjunction with HIV medications suffer additional care requirements for ADL's, nutrition and exercise. Long term care facilities typically are not step up to service same sex couples and they may incur additional isolation in these institutions.

The largest issue that I deal with everyday regardless of sexual identification is transportation and accompaniment to a doctor's appointment. Para transit in its current state isn't structured for accompaniment and long delays in picking up an elder patient at a doctor's appointment are the norm rather than the exception. Frail elders waiting in an office lobby or curbside for transportation is unacceptable and borders on neglect.

I would appreciate the opportunity to serve on this committee and bring my skill set to resolve some of critical issues that our LBGT seniors face.

Qualifications

I have been involved with LGBT aging issues as a volunteer, an advocate, a service provider and lately as a consumer for 16 years. Starting as a Friendly Visitor volunteer when I was 44 in 1996 for what was then, GLOE (Gay and Lesbian Outreach to Elders) I have had intimate direct contact with LGBT seniors. Visiting in their homes, listening to their concerns, driving them to appointments, I have learned first hand how isolated, shamed, economically challenged, distrusting of mainstream services and marginalized this community is.

I was 44. By then I had been living and almost dying with AIDS for 14 years. I saw the direct, multiple impact of the isolation of aging in the LGBT community, with the loss, grief and trauma of the AIDS epidemic. Elders not only lost their partners of many years, but also the loss of the next generation (my generation) which would have been their caregivers.

From 1996 on, my involvement with aging in this community became more and more extensive, as did my understanding of the distinct issues involved. I became the Friendly Visitor coordinator of GLOE, then the assistant program director. As my own health got better with the first wave of AIDS cocktails, I went back to school, to New College graduate school, and received a degree in socio-clinical psychology (MA) and became a Marriage and Family Therapist intern.

I stayed with my passion and continued full-time employment with the newly named New Leaf Outreach to Elders as the Social Services worker in 2000. From 1998 to 2008 I was involved with many ground-breaking advocacy and cultural competency trainings concerning the aging issues of the LGBT community.

For brevity's sake and with the understanding that many of these dates are 'guesstimates', some of the highlights were:

- In 1997 assisting Dana Van Gorder with the Department of Public Health, conducted cultural competency trainings for 900 nurses, nurses aides and assistants at Laguna Honda Hospital.
As a baseline, we found that 30% of these health workers were supportive of the LGBT population, 30% had negative views, and 30% were indifferent (10% no reply). I mention this anecdotal finding and the % because throughout a decade later of trainings I personally conducted with at least 19 city agencies serving elders, I found the same percentage breakdown.
- In 1998, Nancy Flaxman (I gladly give her the most credit) developed a senior speaker's bureau under the auspices of the LGBT Senior Collaborative (San Francisco, Marin, East Bay). It was awarded the "Best Practices" award in 1999 by the American Society on Aging.
- In 2002 I was invited to participate in the first nation-wide "Senior Roundtable" on LGBT senior issues by the NGLTF (National Gay and Lesbian Task Force) held in Washington, D.C.
- In 2003 I was the liason between the LGBT senior community and the LGBT advisory council of the Human Rights Commission to hold a hearing on senior issues. It was the first government sponsored event of its kind. The report, findings and recommendations remain the most extensive to this date.

Qualifications (cont'd)

There were so many conferences and trainings throughout these years, I'll list some of the chronology in my 'work' and 'civic experience.' One highlight I was privileged to be a part of in 2006 was the first "Sit-Down" discussion of LGBT senior issues with the CEO of AARP, Bill Roselli (?). Marcy Adelman, Moli Steinhart, Brian deVries and myself were the participants in this historic moment with mainstream aging and LGBT aging experts.

I was also a part of many groundbreaking social programs dedicated to assuage isolation in the LGBT elder community. Some highlights are:

- "Lunch Bunch", a collaboration with Curry Senior Center and New Leaf Outreach to Elders, 1998-2008.
- Laguna Honda "Rainbow Senior Social Group", awarded the San Francisco mayoral Certificate of Merit, 1998-2008.
- "Geezer's Ball", awarded by Mark Leno, state assemblyman, the Certificate of Appreciation, 2000-2005.
- NLOE "HIV Senior Men's Support Group", 2000-2008.

My transferable skill is perhaps my respect and authenticity that has earned me the trust I continue to receive by the elders of the community, in particular the women of the community.

Not having been born and raised in the non-profit world, I have the ability to humanize the issues and cut through the 'agency-speak' in meetings, groups, presentations and trainings. I'm outcome-oriented and have a knowledge of history in this area to avoid re-inventing the wheel, but rather seek goals and actions that would serve the issues. I bring levity *and* seriousness to the table. I'm a good listener and a good speaker.

My particular interests of late are outreach and true advocacy of bisexual elder issues; HIV and aging; appropriate outreach to people of color and low-income seniors; and distinguishing of not only the older generation of seniors, but the new emerging socio-economics of the baby boomer LGBT "new" seniors.

Currently, living with non-HIV disabilities, I am also interested in advocacy for people with disabilities in the LGBT community.

16 (b) The research that is available shows alarming areas of disparity in housing,
17 government and social support, medical and mental health, and other factors compared to
18 heterosexual counterparts; in particular, studies have shown an almost universal fear of being
19 out in senior facilities due to perceived intolerance and ignorance on the part of staff and other
20 seniors.

21 (c) Various advisory bodies in San Francisco have studied issues relating to LGBT
22 seniors and have recommended systemic policies to implement city-wide change in the
23 specific areas of housing, health and social services, legal status and equity, research and
24 demographics, and community within community.
25

1 (d) While some of the recommendations have been implemented, many of them have
2 not.

3 Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding
4 Article XII of Chapter 5, Sections 5.110 through 5.115, to read as follows:

5
6 **SEC. 5.110. CREATION OF TASK FORCE.**

7 The Board of Supervisors hereby establishes a Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender
8 ("LGBT") Seniors Task Force ("the Task Force") for the City and County of San Francisco.

9
10 **SEC. 5.111. PURPOSE.**

11 The Task Force shall advise the Board of Supervisors on matters relating to the needs and
12 concerns of senior members of the LGBT community.

13
14 **SEC. 5.112. MEMBERSHIP.**

15 (a) The Task Force shall consist of 415 members, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
16 Members shall include LGBT seniors and aging adults, and people with expertise or experience
17 working on issues affecting LGBT seniors. Appointments shall reflect the diversity of the seniors LGBT
18 community, including race, ethnicity, religion, gender identity, socio economic status, disability
19 (including HIV/AIDS status), and other relevant characteristics.

20 (b) All members of the Task Force shall be residents of the City and County, in accordance
21 with Section 4.101 of the Charter. The Board of Supervisors may waive the residency requirement if it
22 finds that a resident of the City and County with specific experience, skills or qualifications willing to
23 serve could not be located within the City and County.

24
25 **SEC. 5.113. ORGANIZATION AND TERMS OF OFFICE.**

1 (a) Members of the Task Force shall serve for the life of the Task Force; provided, however,
2 that the Board of Supervisors may remove any member of the Task Force at any time.

3 (b) In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any member, the Board of
4 Supervisors shall appoint a successor for the unexpired term of the office vacated.

5 (c) The Task Force shall elect its own officers and shall establish rules for its own organization
6 and procedures. The Task Force shall meet when necessary as determined by the Task Force;
7 provided, however, that the Task Force shall hold a regular meeting not less than once every month.
8 Except as provided by law, all meetings of the Task Force shall be open to the public.

9 (d) Services of the members of the Task Force shall be voluntary and members will serve
10 without compensation. Any member who misses two regularly-scheduled meetings of the Task Force
11 within a six-month period without the express approval of the Task Force at a regularly-scheduled
12 meeting will be deemed to have resigned from the Task Force.

13 (e) The Department of Aging and Adult Services shall provide administrative support to the
14 Task Force. All City departments, commissions, boards and agencies shall cooperate with the Task
15 Force in conducting its business.

16
17 **SEC. 5.114. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE.**

18 (a) The Task Force may hold hearings and take testimony regarding LGBT senior issues and
19 related matters.

20 (b) The Task Force may create subcommittees as necessary; provided, however that the Task
21 Force shall establish working groups on: housing; health and social services; legal status and equity;
22 research and demographics; and community-within-community. The working groups shall reach out to
23 and invite other members of the community and experts who can help with the work of the Task Force
24 to participate with the working groups in an advisory role, including the special committee of the
25

1 Advisory Council on Human Rights for LGBT issues established under Administrative Code
2 Section 12A.6(c).

3 (c) The Task Force shall review, update and create implementation plans for recommendations
4 in existing reports including, without limitation, the 2003 HRC Report on LGBT Seniors, the 2010 Ryan
5 White HIV Care Council Report on HIV and Aging, and the 2011 Report of the SRO Task Force.

6 (d) No later than 15 months after its first meeting, the Task Force shall create a written report
7 and transmit that report to the Board of Supervisors. The report shall include action plans for
8 implementation of recommendations, timelines for implementation, estimated costs, and potential
9 funding sources plus additional information to facilitate implementation.

10
11 **SEC. 5.115. SUNSET PROVISION.**

12 This Article shall expire by operation of law, and the LGBT Senior Task Force shall terminate,
13 eighteen months after the first meeting of the Task Force. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause
14 this Article to be removed from the Administrative Code.

15
16 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the
17 date of passage.


