**RE: Ordinance 250487 – Recommended Amendments**

Dear Board of Supervisors:

As the Treatment on Demand Coalition, we are a diverse stakeholder group of San Francisco community members and service providers, including residents, people who use drugs, family members, advocates, medical professionals, and researchers. We work collaboratively to uphold and expand the City's mental health and substance use disorder treatment framework established under Proposition T (2008), which committed San Francisco to a "treatment on demand" policy.

Thank you for the focus and attention on better citywide accessibility for behavioral health services with Ordinance 250487. We appreciate the spirit of this legislation, but we understand certain provisions in this ordinance can be further developed to improve access to behavioral health services and achieving our shared goal of treatment on demand.

**Fair Share Rule**

The Fair Share Rule suggests that the use of behavioral health services is specific to homelessness while the reality is that people who are not experiencing homelessness also access and use behavioral health services. In addition, applying these homelessness numbers to approve behavioral health services is not suitable or relevant to assess the opening of a new behavioral health service location. Because of this non-relevant assessment, **we support a removal of "Behavioral Health Residential Care and Treatment Facility" and "Behavioral Health Specialized Outpatient Clinic" under the definition of Covered Facilities.**

**Enhanced Care**

Opportunities exist to maximize care by enhancing service models in non-Covered Facility locations with co-located behavioral health care. For example, the City funds the Citywide Roving Team and PHACS that support permanent supportive housing tenants with behavioral health challenges. Yet, this ordinance would prohibit these programs benefitting tenants and virtually all additive and co-located care. **We urge that spaces where people and communities already access care and support be exempted.**

**Funding**

The State of California and the City and County of San Francisco are heavily focusing on policy responses and significant resources towards behavioral health treatment. In addition, the upcoming Continuum of Care (CoC) funding is extremely likely to be geared towards behavioral health treatment. While we understand that behavioral health treatment will not uniquely solve homelessness, accessing and leveraging these resources may be hampered with this ordinance. **We recommend further consideration to ensure that no money is left on the table.**

We appreciate all consideration of our recommendations. In addition, we also serve as a useful space to engage in the development of policy efforts. Accordingly, we sincerely welcome and appreciate all future opportunities to partner and collaborate on solutions to improve the local behavioral health system. Dear Supervisor Mahmood and Members of the Board,

On behalf of the Bay Area Council, I write to express our support for the proposed Geographic Equity Ordinance. San Francisco today has approximately 11 percent of the Bay Area's population, 20 percent of the region's homeless shelters, and over 40 percent of the region's Permanent Supportive Housing. This over-concentration of the region's homeless infrastructure isn't spread throughout the city but is instead further concentrated into just a handful of neighborhoods.

This disparity deprives homeless residents in the city's underserved neighborhoods of critical services while burdening all residents in over-served neighborhoods with the externalities that come with high concentrations of high-needs individuals.

The proposed Geographic Equity Ordinance defines a fair-share threshold for the geographic distribution of homeless shelters and interim housing in the City based on a capacity ratio calculated by the percentage of homeless residents and homeless shelters currently located in a neighborhood. This rational approach would help make sure the city is meeting homeless residents where they're at, rather than forcing them to relocate to where they're not. These elements not only help guarantee fairness but also foster public buy-in.

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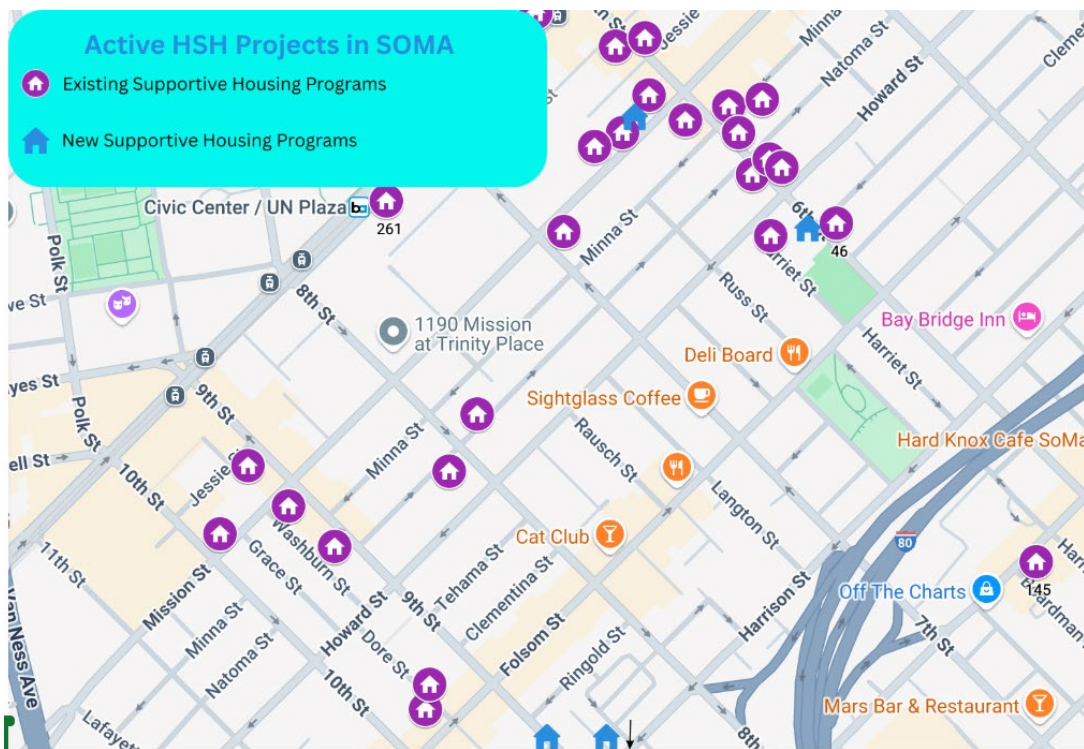
Hello SF Officials,

I'm writing in support of the Bilal Mahmood's Equitable Shelter Ordinance. I live on Natoma Street between 6th and 7th Streets. I had the privilege of becoming a homeowner in the middle of the covid pandemic at the beginning of 2021. At the time, I was aware of some of the issues with Soma, particularly that most people advise "not to live there." Against prevailing internet wisdom, my wife and I decided to purchase a condo in West Soma to be in proximity to our respective offices. The ironic thing is that neither one of us would return to our physical offices, as they both closed permanently during covid.

Prior to moving to Soma we had lived in Cow Hollow, Pac Heights, and Lower Polk. We've been SF residents since the beginning of 2017. Moving to SOMA has opened our eyes quite a bit on the complexity of homelessness, drug use, and mental health issues in San Francisco, and the country more broadly.

We've also become incredibly involved in our community. I am one of the founding members of the Soma West Neighborhood association. It's through my involvement in the community that I've come to learn who my neighbors are and what type of people live in Soma. The people who live here are young professionals, families, artists, activists, children and families. What I appreciate most about this neighborhood is its diverse, kind, and thoughtful people.

Homelessness is present in all of San Francisco, but it's different in our neighborhood (as well as Tenderloin, Mission, Bayview, and the Castro) compared to the rest of the city. Honestly, it's something that I am jealous of for people who live in neighborhoods like Pac Heights, NoPa, and other more Western neighborhoods all bordering Golden Gate Park.



Soma in addition to having the highest concentration of supportive housing projects, also has the least amount of green space. Does this make sense?

I expect that this legislation will be passed without any real mechanism for enforcement of other districts doing their share, because the homelessness crisis is one of the issues being mandated to be resolved by SF voters and the mayor's supporters. So SF will get its 8000+ shelter beds, at the expense of certain neighborhoods that also happen to be the neighborhoods that have higher concentrations of people of color.

From a day to day perspective, this is the impact of the unhoused on people in my neighborhood:

- regularly cleaning up human waste. I've personally picked up human feces dozens of times in the past 2 years, because if I don't, who will? Definitely not DPW. The CBD will do this, but I'm not going to wait around when there is feces stinking up our entrance.
- being on higher alert walking through our neighborhood. I don't assume anyone is a danger to me, my wife, or my dog, but at the same time, "street" people are unpredictable, and require vigilance that is not required in other parts of SF. This adds a constant mental load moving through our neighborhood
- compassion fatigue from seeing all the people passed out or overdosing on the street. it's not possible for me as an individual to check on every passed out person. children should not be walking by this either.
- filthy streets. beyond the human waste, there is trash everywhere from people discarding things, rummaging through stolen trash bags (ironic because there aren't trash cans)

Will adding more homeless shelters/beds to the neighborhood improve any of the above? Will it make it worse? Honestly it is hard to say, but if a neighborhood is going to be exploited for this purpose, at the very least it should be getting services and support commensurate. If there is going to be X million dollars spent in the neighborhood by HSH and non-profits supporting the unhoused, mentally ill, and drug users, there should be at least X million dollars spent

supporting the residents that are making the neighborhood something greater than a place that is drug friendly and easy to camp out publicly. My demands would be the following for spatial equity:

- actually clean the streets
- add public bathrooms. Ocean beach gets a portable bathroom rolled in daily, but SOMA doesn't get something like this despite knowing that there is an unhoused population.
- add add trash cans (Paris has trash cans everywhere)
- subsidize small businesses so there are restaurants, retail, and other businesses that make the neighborhood thrive
- invest in green space

The public is becoming wise to what is going on, and things that don't make sense won't be allowed to continue. So what makes more sense, building all homeless infrastructure in a concentrated part of the city or distributing these services across the entire city? I can't control how the rest of the city votes, but at the very least, the neighborhoods that are already burdened should not be burdened more.

I'd also encourage you to not listen to the idiots that are telling you to build homeless shelters outside of the city. Their vision for tackling homelessness sounds like concentration camps. What does that look like?

- rounding up unhoused in SF against their will
- bussing them to a location outside of San Francisco

Homelessness needs to be tackled as a coalition of California cities, California as a whole, and ideally nationwide. SF cannot "solve" homelessness on its own. It is a state and national issue that is rooted in economics and unjust systems. The best thing that SF can do is try to be a model of good governance and set a vision for statewide and national policies to get people off the streets.

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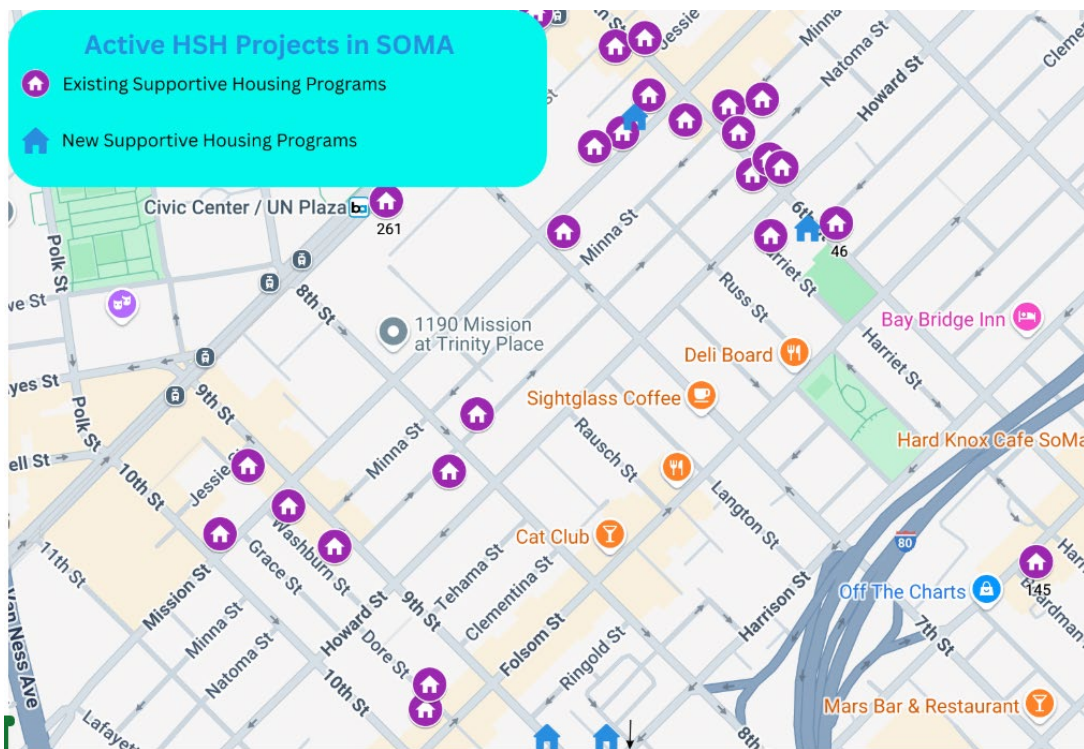
Hello SF Officials,

I'm writing in support of the Bilal Mahmood's Equitable Shelter Ordinance. I live on Natoma Street between 6th and 7th Streets. I had the privilege of becoming a homeowner in the middle of the covid pandemic at the beginning of 2021. At the time, I was aware of some of the issues with Soma, particularly that most people advise "not to live there." Against prevailing internet wisdom, my wife and I decided to purchase a condo in West Soma to be in proximity to our respective offices. The ironic thing is that neither one of us would return to our physical offices, as they both closed permanently during covid.

Prior to moving to Soma we had lived in Cow Hollow, Pac Heights, and Lower Polk. We've been SF residents since the beginning of 2017. Moving to SOMA has opened our eyes quite a bit on the complexity of homelessness, drug use, and mental health issues in San Francisco, and the country more broadly.

We've also become incredibly involved in our community. I am one of the founding members of the Soma West Neighborhood association. It's through my involvement in the community that I've come to learn who my neighbors are and what type of people live in Soma. The people who live here are young professionals, families, artists, activists, children and families. What I appreciate most about this neighborhood is its diverse, kind, and thoughtful people.

Homelessness is present in all of San Francisco, but it's different in our neighborhood (as well as Tenderloin, Mission, Bayview, and the Castro) compared to the rest of the city. Honestly, it's something that I am jealous of for people who live in neighborhoods like Pac Heights, NoPa, and other more Western neighborhoods all bordering Golden Gate Park.



Soma in addition to having the highest concentration of supportive housing projects, also has the least amount of green space. Does this make sense?

I expect that this legislation will be passed without any real mechanism for enforcement of other districts doing their share, because the homelessness crisis is one of the issues being mandated to be resolved by SF voters and the mayor's supporters. So SF will get its 8000+ shelter beds, at the expense of certain neighborhoods that also happen to be the neighborhoods that have higher concentrations of people of color.

From a day to day perspective, this is the impact of the unhoused on people in my neighborhood:

- regularly cleaning up human waste. I've personally picked up human feces dozens of times in the past 2 years, because if I don't, who will? Definitely not DPW. The CBD will do this, but I'm not going to wait around when there is feces stinking up our entrance.
- being on higher alert walking through our neighborhood. I don't assume anyone is a danger to me, my wife, or my dog, but at the same time, "street" people are unpredictable, and require vigilance that is not required in other parts of SF. This adds a constant mental load moving through our neighborhood
- compassion fatigue from seeing all the people passed out or overdosing on the street. it's not possible for me as an individual to check on every passed out person. children should not be walking by this either.
- filthy streets. beyond the human waste, there is trash everywhere from people discarding things, rummaging through stolen trash bags (ironic because there aren't trash cans)

Will adding more homeless shelters/beds to the neighborhood improve any of the above? Will it make it worse? Honestly it is hard to say, but if a neighborhood is going to be exploited for this purpose, at the very least it should be getting services and support commensurate. If there is going to be X million dollars spent in the neighborhood by HSH and non-profits supporting the unhoused, mentally ill, and drug users, there should be at least X million dollars spent

supporting the residents that are making the neighborhood something greater than a place that is drug friendly and easy to camp out publicly. My demands would be the following for spatial equity:

- actually clean the streets
- add public bathrooms. Ocean beach gets a portable bathroom rolled in daily, but SOMA doesn't get something like this despite knowing that there is an unhoused population.
- add add trash cans (Paris has trash cans everywhere)
- subsidize small businesses so there are restaurants, retail, and other businesses that make the neighborhood thrive
- invest in green space

The public is becoming wise to what is going on, and things that don't make sense won't be allowed to continue. So what makes more sense, building all homeless infrastructure in a concentrated part of the city or distributing these services across the entire city? I can't control how the rest of the city votes, but at the very least, the neighborhoods that are already burdened should not be burdened more.

I'd also encourage you to not listen to the idiots that are telling you to build homeless shelters outside of the city. Their vision for tackling homelessness sounds like concentration camps. What does that look like?

- rounding up unhoused in SF against their will
- bussing them to a location outside of San Francisco

Homelessness needs to be tackled as a coalition of California cities, California as a whole, and ideally nationwide. SF cannot "solve" homelessness on its own. It is a state and national issue that is rooted in economics and unjust systems. The best thing that SF can do is try to be a model of good governance and set a vision for statewide and national policies to get people off the streets.

As a resident of SOMA since 2015, I'm writing in strong support of Supervisor Mahmood's Equitable Shelter Distribution Ordinance.

I love SOMA West deeply—it's vibrant, diverse, and economically vital to San Francisco's recovery. I bought a home here and I don't want to live anywhere else. But if street conditions continue to deteriorate and crime continues to rise, I may be forced to reconsider. SOMA is currently bearing a disproportionate share of the city's shelter infrastructure, and it's having a real impact—not just on residents, but on local businesses and the broader economy.

SOMA hosts many of San Francisco's most important commercial corridors, hospitality venues, and cultural institutions, including Moscone Center, SF MOMA, hotels, and key office districts the city is working to revitalize. Yet shelters continue to be concentrated here—in 2025 alone, four out of five new shelters were placed in Western SOMA, despite the fact that SOMA and the Tenderloin already host the vast majority of the City's shelters.

At the same time, the City has not made sufficient investment in sanitation, safety, or behavioral health services in the impacted neighborhoods. Without that support, shelter clustering near commercial areas discourages foot traffic, harms small businesses, and deters conventions and tourism, ultimately weakening our city's economic recovery and diminishing quality of life for those of us who live here.

For SOMA's economy to recover, we need a stable and diverse population that includes residents who are able to support neighborhood businesses, contribute to a vibrant street life, and invest in the long-term success of the community. When residential housing is displaced to create yet another shelter—as with 1178 Folsom—the neighborhood loses more of its economic foundation.

One well-managed shelter would not be a concern on its own. But when there are several within just one or two blocks, some of which have caused persistent challenges, the effects add up. Each neighborhood should include a balanced mix of housing, commerce, and services. Shelters should not just continue to be concentrated in just a few vulnerable geographies when other districts have none.

This ordinance asks for equitable distribution of shelters and reasonable spacing between sites. As a longtime SOMA resident and civic participant, I see this as a commonsense step toward fairness, economic sustainability, and compassionate service delivery—for both housed and unhoused San Franciscans.

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As a resident of SOMA (since 2020), I am writing to express my strong support for Supervisor Mahmood's proposed Equitable Shelter Distribution Ordinance. This policy initiative represents a necessary step toward correcting long-standing geographic disparities in the placement of shelter infrastructure across San Francisco.

SOMA West is a culturally rich, economically vital neighborhood that plays a pivotal role in the city's post-pandemic economic revitalization. I chose to make my home here because of its vibrancy and diversity, and I remain deeply invested in its future. However, the continued overconcentration of shelter facilities—without proportional investment in public safety, sanitation, and behavioral health services—is contributing to a decline in neighborhood livability and economic resilience.

Despite hosting many of San Francisco's primary commercial corridors, cultural institutions, and hospitality assets—including Moscone Center, SF MOMA, and major hotel and office nodes—SOMA continues to absorb a disproportionate share of the city's shelter infrastructure. In 2025 alone, 80% of newly opened shelters were sited in Western SOMA, adding to an already unequal distribution of such facilities between our neighborhood and others such as the Tenderloin.

This inequitable siting pattern contradicts sound urban planning principles, which call for balanced land use, functional zoning, and distributed social services to prevent undue pressure on any one community. Furthermore, the clustering of shelters in areas already under significant economic and public health stress creates measurable externalities, including reduced foot traffic, commercial displacement, and deterrence of tourism and convention activity—all of which undermine San Francisco's broader recovery

objectives.

The loss of residential housing, such as at 1178 Folsom, to accommodate additional shelter beds further erodes the socioeconomic foundation of the neighborhood. A thriving urban ecosystem depends on a mixed-use fabric, where residential stability supports local commerce, civic participation, and long-term community development.

It is important to clarify: this ordinance is not an argument against shelters or their necessity, but rather a call for spatial equity and policy fairness. A single well-managed shelter can be a positive neighborhood asset. However, when multiple shelters are colocated within a small radius—without adequate wraparound services or infrastructure support—the cumulative impacts become unsustainable.

Supervisor Mahmood's ordinance seeks to introduce rational siting criteria, including geographic distribution and appropriate spacing thresholds. These are common-sense, evidence-based mechanisms that will enhance service delivery, protect neighborhood integrity, and ensure a more equitable sharing of civic responsibility citywide.

As a committed SOMA resident and engaged stakeholder in San Francisco's future, I strongly urge you to support this ordinance. It represents a meaningful move toward balanced urban policy, equitable service provision, and sustainable community development—for all San Franciscans, housed and unhoused alike.

Though I want to address my opposition, regarding agenda item #14 - to require the city to approve at least one shelter, behavioral health center or transitional housing in each district by June 30, 2026.

This is poor policy. To start, this doesn't try and solve the root cause of our homeless and drug problem today.

To get real about solving the homeless and drug problem on our streets...

- it will take a combination of arresting and deporting drug dealers
- a mix of incarcerating users and getting them into the right treatment and services that are abstinence and drug free based unless a medical professional prescribes otherwise
- significantly reduce cash hand outs and subsidies, especially for those who are incapable of living on their own and who were not previously a San Francisco resident prior to falling into crisis

Voting "Yes" on Supervisor Mahmood's ordinance will only create problems in the Richmond and Sunset where both homelessness and drug use is significantly less than in D5 and D6.

Furthermore, voting "Yes" on the ordinance without knowing the costs it'll take to build in other districts (as we're trying to climb our way out of a deficit), who would manage the newly built facilities (60.5% of overdose deaths between Jan-April 2025 happened at a fixed address) etc is a haphazard and lazy approach.

Lastly, this ordinance, if passed would negatively impact the quality of life on everyday San Franciscans. Please protect each of your districts, home to many seniors and families and vote "No" on Supervisor Mahmood's proposed ordinance.
