GRANTING REVOCABLE PERMISSION TO THE SAN FRANCISCO ART COMMISSION TO INSTALL WORKS OF ART BY BRIAN GOGGIN IN THE PAVING SURFACE OF BUS BULBS TO BE CONSTRUCTED BY MUNI ON THE NORTHERLY AND SOUTHERLY SIDES OF MISSION STREET BETWEEN PRECITA AVENUE AND CORTLAND AVENUE AND ADOPTING FINDINGS PURSUANT TO PLANNING CODE SECTION 101.1.

RESOLVED, That permission, revocable at the will of the Board of Supervisors and automatically terminating upon failure to continue in force the provisions and requirements of the Street Encroachment Agreement hereafter referred to, is hereby granted to The San Francisco Art Commission to occupy a portion of the public rights-of-way on the northerly and southerly sides of Mission Street, between Precita Avenue and Cortland Avenue for the purpose of installing and maintaining nine (9) works of art by Brian Goggin, as shown on the plans, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the project intended by the encroachment is consistent with the eight priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1; in that:

- 1. The project for the installation of works of art in the paving surface of bus bulbs to be constructed by MUNI, and will have no adverse effect on neighborhood serving retail uses or opportunities for employment in or ownership of such businesses.
- The project would have no adverse effect on the City's housing stock or on neighborhood 2. character.
- The project would have no adverse effect on the City's supply of affordable housing. 3.
- The project would not result in commuter traffic impeding MUNI transit service or 4. overburdening the streets or neighborhood parking.
- 5. The project would not adversely affect the industrial or service sectors or future opportunities for resident employment or ownership in these sectors.

- 6. The project would not adversely affect achieving the greatest possible preparedness against injury and loss of life in an earthquake.
- 7. The project would have no adverse effect on landmarks or historic buildings.
- 8. The project would have no adverse effect on parks and open space or their access to sunlight or vistas.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That this permission shall not become effective until:

There shall have been executed and acknowledged by the Permittee and the Director of Public Works a Street Encroachment Agreement, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. __991571 __ and which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, and the copy of this resolution attached thereto as Exhibit A.

FURTHER PROVIDED, The permittee, at the permittee's sole expense, and as is necessary as a result of this permit, shall make arrangements: [1] to provide for the support and protection of facilities belonging to the Department of Public Works, public utility companies, the San Francisco Water Department, the San Francisco Fire Department and other City departments; [2] to remove or to change the location of such facilities and provide access to such facilities for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing, maintaining, operating or repairing such facilities.

FURTHER PROVIDED, That the Permittee shall procure the necessary permits for the Central Permit Bureau, Department of Building Inspection and/or Bureau of Street-use and Mapping, Department of Public Works, and pay the necessary permit fees and inspection fees before starting work.

FURTHER PROVIDED, That the Board of Supervisors reserves the right to exact a permit fee, or rental, for the use of said street areas for the purpose of performance of its governmental or proprietary activities, including the constructing, reconstructing, maintaining, operating, repairing, removing and use of public utilities located under, over or along said street area;

FURTHER PROVIDED, That no structure shall be erected or constructed in said sidewalk areas except as specifically permitted herein;

FURTHER PROVIDED, That the permittee shall assume all costs and maintenance and repair of the encroachments and no cost or obligation of any kind shall accrue to the City and County of San Francisco by reason of this permission granted.
