[Resolution urging full funding of CHIPPS.]

Resolution urging full funding and implementation of the Community and Home Injury Prevention Project for Seniors (CHIPPS) by the San Francisco Department of Public Health.

WHEREAS, The leading cause of injury death to seniors is from falls in the home, which causes 32% of injury deaths to San Francisco seniors; and

WHEREAS, The leading cause of injury hospitalization of seniors is from falls in the home, which causes 77% of San Francisco senior hospitalizations; and,

WHEREAS, In 1996 an estimated \$40 million annually was spent on hospitalization of senior injuries (excluding Kaiser), with 75% resulting from falls in the home; and,

WHEREAS, In San Francisco, falls in the home account for 74% of all injury hospitalization discharges to long-term residential or home health service care; and,

WHEREAS, For seniors, who frequently require extensive follow-up care, including long-term institutionalization, permanent dependency on family members or attendants, home renovations and other direct and indirect costs, actual costs, both financially and mentally are considerably higher; and,

WHEREAS, Household hazards such as falls, burns and scalds pose special problems to older people, and it is possible to prevent many such injuries; and,

WHEREAS, There is a common misconception that falling and injuries such as a broken hip happen by chance and for those over age 60, such events are seen as an inevitable consequences of aging; and,

WHEREAS, Injuries of seniors and persons with disabilities in the home can be prevented; and,

WHEREAS, Injury prevention is less expensive to the City over time than is treatment after the fact; and,

WHEREAS, The Community and Home Injury Prevention Project for Seniors (CHIPPS) helped older people avoid these problems at home and in the community from 1992 to February, 2004; and,

WHEREAS, The goals of CHIPPS are:

- Create awareness that many injuries to older people can be prevented,
- Develop simple ways to recognize and correct injury hazards,
- Provide resources and information to health professionals and the public; and,

WHEREAS, CHIPPS provides educational presentations, workshops, home assessments and small home modifications to San Francisco seniors; and,

WHEREAS, CHIPPS is not funded and has been in effect not staffed since February 2004; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors calls for full implementation of the Community and Home Injury Prevention Project for Seniors (CHIPPS) by the San Francisco Department of Public Health.
