Resolution Urging the Immigrant Rights Commission To Explore And Advise The Board Of Supervisors On The Management Of The Day Laborer Program.

WHEREAS, Continuity of the San Francisco Day Laborer Program is important to immigrants seeking employment and to the community overall; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors appropriated \$100,000 in FY 2002-2003 and appropriated \$90,000 in FY 2003-2004 for the management of the San Francisco Day Laborer Program and to date \$25,000 of these funds have been expended for the intended purpose of the management of the Program, representing reimbursement for expenses through September 30, 2002; and

WHEREAS, The contract awarded in April of 2000 by the Mayor's Office of Community Development to La Raza Centro Legal for the management of the Program expired on June 30, 2002, and contract extensions expired September 30, 2002, and to date no organization has been awarded with a contract to manage the Program; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office of Community Development (MOCD) July 2002 and August 2002 RFP's to competitively bid the San Francisco Day Laborer Program did not yield a successful selection of the Program's manager; and

WHEREAS, On September of 2002, the Citizens Committee on Community

Development of the MOCD transferred responsibility for the administration of the Program to the Immigrant Rights Commission in September of 2002; and

WHEREAS, MOCD transferred responsibility for selecting a contractor to manage the San Francisco Day Laborer Program to the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Services (MONS) in September of 2002 but to date the MONS has not awarded the contracts; and

WHEREAS, The Immigrant Rights Commission is charged with improving the quality of life of immigrants within our community; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors Urges the Immigrant Rights Commission to explore and advise the Board of Supervisors on the management of the Day Laborer Program; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Immigrant Rights Commission should explore and advise the Board of Supervisors regarding (1) whether entering into a month-to-month contract with a nonprofit organization to ensure continuity of services is appropriate pending the outcome of the MONS RFP process, and (2) whether reimbursing organizations for services already rendered for the management of the Program is appropriate; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Immigrant Rights Commission should, once the RFP is finished, review the RFP and monitor the MONS process of choosing a nonprofit to run it; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, Once the Contract is awarded, the Immigrant Rights Commission should manage the contract after the selection.
