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7	WHEREAS, In a February 26, 2021, letter to President Biden, Representatives Lucy
8	McBath (D-Ga.) and Joe Neguse (D-Co.) requested the appointment of a National Director of
9	Gun Violence Prevention who would create and chair an Interagency Task Force on Gun
10	Violence Prevention; and
11	WHEREAS, The Representatives rightly acknowledged that existing federal efforts to
12	address gun violence are disparate and that an Interagency Task Force on Gun Violence
13	Prevention would ensure that a more comprehensive and coordinated approach be
14	implemented; and
15	WHEREAS, Every year in the United States, over 115,000 people are shot, including
16	8,000 children and teens, and 40,000 people die by gun violence, including over 23,000 who
17	tragically take their own lives; and
18	WHEREAS, Gun violence disproportionately impacts communities of color; and
19	WHEREAS, Gun violence exacts a physical, emotional, and financial toll on survivors
20	and their families, as well as the families of victims who lose their lives, and the effects of gun
21	violence are felt by communities in the form of reduced investment from businesses and
22	entrepreneurs; and
23	WHEREAS, Gun violence also imposes significant costs on taxpayers and the local
24	governments tasked with addressing the issue; and
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1	WHEREAS, Despite historic declines in violent crime reported in San Francisco in
2	2019, in 2020 there was a 63% increase in gun related incidents that resulted in two tragic
3	deaths; and
4	WHEREAS, In December of 2019 the Board of Supervisors passed the Vision Zero on
5	Homicides and Violent Crimes Plan, which calls for immediate action to limit the causes of
6	violence in San Francisco; now, therefore, be it
7	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
8	recognizes the legitimate threat to public health and safety that gun violence has on our
9	community; and, be it
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
11	Francisco supports the appointment of a National Director of Gun Violence Prevention and the
12	creation of an Interagency Task Force on Gun Violence Prevention, and urges Members of
13	Congress to support it as well; and, be it
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk
15	of the Board to transmit copies of this Resolution to Senators Dianne Feinstein and Alex
16	Padilla, Speaker Nancy Pelosi, and Representative Jackie Speier upon passage.
