

1 [Declaration of Election Results.]

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3 **Resolution declaring the results of the November 6, 2001 Consolidated Municipal**  
4 **Election.**

5 WHEREAS, A Consolidated Municipal Election was conducted in the City and County  
6 of San Francisco on Tuesday, November 6, 2001, which placed before the electorate  
7 candidates for election to two City and County elective offices, eight City and County ballot  
8 measures, one Municipal Utility District measure, and candidates for election to five municipal  
9 utility district wards; and,

10 WHEREAS, The Director of Elections of the City and County of San Francisco has  
11 certified to this Board of Supervisors the results of the Consolidated Municipal Election, a  
12 copy of which is contained in file \_\_\_\_\_ of the Board of Supervisors, and which is  
13 incorporated herein by reference; now, therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors does hereby declare, pursuant to Section  
15 9269 of the California Elections Code, the results of the Consolidated Municipal Election  
16 conducted in the City and County of San Francisco on Tuesday, November 6, 2001, as  
17 certified by the Director of Elections, as follows:
