2 AUTHORIZING THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT ~~TO APPLY FOR ACCEPT AND~~ /RETROACTIVELY TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT,  
3 AND TO EXPEND \$62,500 IN FUNDS FROM THE STATE BOARD OF CORRECTIONS PURSUANT  
4 TO THE MENTALLY ILL OFFENDER CRIME REDUCTION GRANTS PROGRAM  
5 (MIOCR); AND, APPROVING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE MIOCR STRATEGY  
6 COMMITTEE.

9 WHEREAS, Due to the deinstitutionalization of severely mentally ill individuals that occurred  
10 in the 1970, many mentally ill people now remain untreated, resulting in impaired functioning,  
11 poverty, homelessness and self-medication with alcohol and controlled substances; and

12 WHEREAS, These behaviors often necessitate police intervention resulting in incarceration;  
13 and

14 WHEREAS, The State Board of Corrections has made available funding, through Mentally Ill  
15 Offender Crime Reduction grants, for development of programs designed to address the needs of  
16 mentally ill offenders during incarceration and upon release; and

17 WHEREAS, the State requires that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Sheriff to apply  
18 for, accept and expend such funding, exclusive of indirect costs, assisted by a Strategy Committee  
19 consisting of mental health professionals and representatives from affected City and criminal  
20 justice agencies; now, therefore, be it

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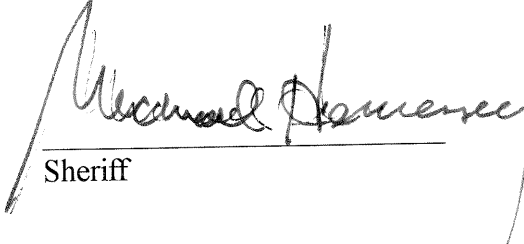

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco will invoice the Board of Corrections for all costs approved in the grant no later than June 30, 1999.

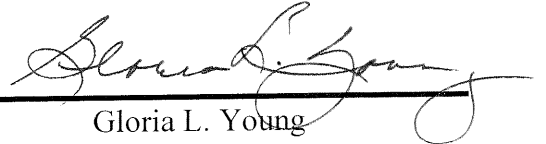

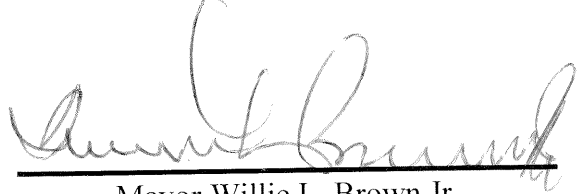
