

1 [Approval of the cost extension application for HIV prevention projects.]

3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) to**
4 **submit a two-year application for calendar years 2010 and 2011 to continue to receive**
5 **funding for the “HIV Prevention Projects” grant from the Centers for Disease Control**
6 **and Prevention (CDC), in the total amount of approximately \$16 million in HIV**
7 **prevention funding for San Francisco; from January 1, 2010 through December 31,**
8 **2011.**

10 WHEREAS, Section 10.170.(b) of the San Francisco Administrative Code requires
11 Board review of proposed annual or otherwise recurring grant applications of \$5,000,000 or
12 more prior to their submission; and,

13 WHEREAS, SFDPH is currently a recipient of the “HIV Prevention Programs”
14 grant in the amount of approximately \$8,824,991 from the CDC for calendar year 2009; and,

15 WHEREAS, For this round of funding, SFDPH was instructed by the CDC to
16 submit a two-year application request, with a budget for 2010 that is identical to last year’s
17 budget, with the budget for 2011 to be determined and sent next year when the CDC sends
18 additional instruction to counties; and,

19 WHEREAS, SFDPH uses these funds to cover a multitude of HIV prevention
20 programs for San Francisco residents, with approximately 35 percent of the total award used
21 for administrative costs (including planning, evaluation, coordination of programs, and contract
22 management) and the remaining 65 percent subcontracted to qualified contractors selected
23 through RFP to provide direct services to clients; and,

24 WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 265-05 requires that City Departments submit applications
25 for approval at least 60 days prior to the grant deadline for review and approval; and,

1 WHEREAS, The CDC released the application announcement on August 4,
2 2009 with a due date of October 5, 2009 allowing just 55 days for the entire process; and,

3 WHEREAS, in the interest of timeliness, SFDPH is making this request for approval by
4 submitting last year's application for the HIV Prevention Projects grant funding from the CDC,
5 also including supporting documents as required, all of which are on file with the Clerk of the
6 Board of Supervisors in File No. 091053, which is hereby declared to be part of the Resolution
7 as if set forth fully herein; and, now, therefore, be it

8 RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors hereby approves SFDPH's
9 application submission to the CDC for the "HIV Prevention Projects" grant for funding in 2010
10 and 2011, to be submitted no later than October 5, 2009.
