2 URGING THE STATE TO RESTORE UNIVERSITYWIDE AIDS RESEARCH PROGRAM  
3 FUNDING IN ORDER TO PROVIDE CORE INFRASTRUCTURE AT THE FIVE MEDICAL  
4 SCHOOL CAMPUSES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA.

6 WHEREAS, The University of California Medical Schools include the campuses of the  
7 University of California at Davis, San Diego, Los Angeles, Irvine and San Francisco; and,

8 WHEREAS, The University of California Medical Schools have been leaders in HIV  
9 research during the AIDS epidemic; and,

10 WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco has preeminent HIV  
11 researchers and has pioneered the field of HIV research; and,

12 WHEREAS, The Universitywide AIDS Research Program (UARP) provides funds for  
13 core infrastructure among the five medical campuses of the University of California; and,

14 WHEREAS, UARP funds for core infrastructure improvements will include virology and  
15 immunology labs, specimen banks, centralized statistical and data management services;  
16 and,

17 WHEREAS, UARP funds are critical to develop complex, cross-disciplinary treatment  
18 for persons with AIDS; and,

19 WHEREAS, UARP funds serve as seed money to leverage federal and state research  
20 funds; and,

21 WHEREAS, The University of California San Francisco states that it currently  
22 leverages \$30.00 for every \$1.00 of UARP funds; and,

23 WHEREAS, Previous gubernatorial administrations diverted funds from California's  
24 UARP to the AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) to accommodate the state's budget  
25 crisis; and,

1           WHEREAS, UARP funding was decreased from approximately \$15 million to its  
2 current level of approximately \$8.9 million; and,

3           WHEREAS, Diversion of funds from UARP to ADAP is no longer necessary because  
4 the ADAP budget can be fully funded as well as the UARP budget; and,

5           WHEREAS, The University of California risks losing its preeminent position in HIV  
6 research as well as valuable state and federal funds; and,

7           WHEREAS, A fully funded UARP will benefit the UCSF School of Medicine as well as  
8 San Franciscans with AIDS; now, therefore, be it

9           RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors supports reinstating funds in the state  
10 budget for the Universitywide AIDS Research Program to its previous level of \$15 million;  
11 and, be it

12           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests His Honor, Mayor  
13 Brown, to transmit a copy of this resolution to the Honorable Gray Davis, Governor of the  
14 State of California.




