11		PURPOSE. On behalf of the people of the State of California, the	

FINDINGS AND PURPOSE. On behalf of the people of the State of California, the City Attorney has obtained civil gang injunctions against the following criminal street gangs that operate in San Francisco's neighborhoods: the Oakdale Mob, Knock Out Posse ("KOP"), Eddy Rock, Chopper City, and the Norteños. Each injunction includes a list of specific gang members against whom the injunction is enforceable. Each injunction applies to a specific geographic area called a "safety zone."

The Board finds that arrest and crime statistics for areas within and immediately surrounding each safety zone are important indicators of whether gang injunctions and other gang suppression activities effectively reduce criminal gang activity and violence. These arrest and crime statistics will also assist policymakers to determine whether gang injunctions may cause gang-related crime to be displaced from safety zones to nearby areas. It is in the interest of the City and County of San Francisco to evaluate the effectiveness of gang suppression activities, including gang injunctions, by compiling statistics regarding crimes and arrests in and around the safety zones.

1	Therefore, it is the intent of the Board to require semi-annual reports of crime and		
2	arrest statistics in the areas within and immediately surrounding the gang injunction safety		
3	zones.		
4	Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding		
5	Section 2A.89, to read as follows:		
6	Sec. 2A.89. REPORTING CRIME AND ARREST STATISTICS IN AND AROUND GANG		
7	INJUNCTION SAFETY ZONES.		
8	(a) Applicability. The requirements of this Section shall apply to all safety zones		
9	established in any permanent civil gang injunction that is in effect on the first date of the reporting		
10	period, including but not limited to the safety zones established in injunctions obtained against the		
11	Oakdale Mob, Knock Out Posse ("KOP"), Eddy Rock, Chopper City, and the Norteño criminal street		
12	gangs.		
13	(b) <b>Definitions.</b>		
14	(1) "Criminal street gang" means any ongoing organization, association, or group of three		
15	or more persons, whether formal or informal, having as one of its primary activities the commission of		
16	one or more of the criminal acts enumerated in Penal Code section 186.22(e)(1)-(25), having a		
17	common name or common identifying sign or symbol, and whose members individually or collectively		
18	engage in or have engaged in a pattern of criminal gang activity.		
19	(2) "Gang injunction" means a permanent civil gang injunction ordered by a court that		
20	prohibits a gang and gang members from engaging in specified activities in a safety zone.		
21	(3) "Safety zone" means the geographic area in which a court has ordered a criminal street		
22	gang and specific gang members not to engage in activities prohibited by the terms of the injunction.		
23	(4) "Areas immediately surrounding the gang injunction safety zone" means the area 1000		
24	feet outside of the outer perimeter of the gang injunction safety zone.

1	(5) "Crime and arrest statistics" means statistics gathered by the San Francisco Police
2	Department for the purpose of monitoring and reporting criminal activity.
3	(6) "Gang-related arrests and crimes" mean all felony crimes or felony criminal charges
4	that are committed or allegedly-committed "for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in association with
5	any criminal street gang, with the specific intent to promote, further, or assist in any criminal conduct
6	by gang members," as defined in Penal Code section 186.22(b)(1).
7	(7) "Unduplicated number of individuals" means the total derived by counting each person
8	only one time for the purpose of computing the relevant statistic.
9	(c) Reporting Crime and Arrest Statistics.
10	(1) Two times each year, the Chief of Police shall prepare a report containing the following
11	crime and arrest statistics. The Chief shall transmit a copy of the report to the Mayor, the Board of
12	Supervisors, the City Attorney, the Police Commission, the District Attorney and the Public Defender.
13	(2) For the period including January 1 through June 30, the Chief shall submit the report
14	no later than July 15. For the period including July 1 through December 31, the Chief shall submit the
15	report no later than January 15 of the following year.
16	(3) The first report shall cover the period July 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. The
17	final report shall cover the period July 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010. After the final report is
18	submitted on or before January 15, 2011, the reporting requirements contained in this Section shall
19	end, unless the Board of Supervisors adopts legislation imposing new requirements. After January 15,
20	2011, if the Board does not renew or amend the requirements of this Section, the City Attorney shall
21	take the necessary administrative steps to delete this Section from the published Administrative Code.
22	(4) Each semi-annual report shall include:
23	(A) The total number of crimes reported and arrests made within each safety zone;
24	(B) A breakdown of the type of crimes reported and arrests made in each safety zone;
